WAGE CUT PER MAN IS SEVEN CENTS AN HOUR

**United Railroad, Labor Board
Cut Wages \$60,000,000 and
Overshot Following This Cut
Followed the Out of \$60,000,
000 on the Maintenance Em-
ployees, Effective July 1.**

CITRUS, June 6.—Wages of rail-
road shop employees were cut \$60,
000,000, yesterday by the United
States railroad labor board. Five
days later, the railroad maintenance
employees were cut another sum.
Details are affected.

The two largest divisions of shop
and equipment maintenance employ-
ees—mechanics, boilermakers, elec-
tricians and electricians—are reduced
seven cents an hour. Pay for freight
car men is cut seven cents an hour
and maintenance of equipment.

Under the decision which is effective
July 1, seven cents an hour is
the minimum rate of pay for
mechanics.

In petitioning for a reduction in pay
of shop workers, the carriers told
the board that a cut was needed
so more men could be employed to re-
pair equipment.

Citizens contend that because of
present high wage rates, railroad em-
ployees are forced to hire men to do
the work.

The board said in its opinion that
there had been a decrease in the
cost of living.

A dissenting opinion was signed by
John Whitcher, Alfred Thompson
and W. L. McCallum, representing In-
dustrial.

The decision, which has been announ-
ced by the railroad labor board, affects
sixty-five of railroad employees in-
volved. One M. K. Jewell, president
of the general department of the Am-
erican Federation of Labor, said:

"Final action for this vote is to be
taken at the meeting of the national
executive committee next week."



There is one postoffice in New York that is just what a four-corners postoffice is supposed to be. It's a hit of "Main Street." It is in Chittenden, the Main Street postoffice, and it is situated in the corner of a general store, furnished with an old fashioned coal stove, and has a sociable crowd that comes down for the mail every morning. Like any village postoffice, it is a news center. Those who receive no mail themselves, stay to help look over that of their friends who do and to exchange gossip. They watch the customers who come in to buy things at the store's counter. Compared to it, any other subscription in New York is automatic, mechanical, inhuman.

DENMARK SEEKS PROTECTION OF MARRIAGE.

A recent decision in the North Carolina supreme court (Crowell vs. Crowell, March 1, 1921) awarded a wife \$10,000 damages against her husband because he infected her with a social disease. This plate of marital protection has received considerable attention in the United States and abroad. In Denmark the royal commission has drafted a bill which provides for precautions against the contracting of marriage by persons suffering from general diseases in contagious stages. In case of fraud on this point the bill gives the deceived wife or husband the right to obtain alimony.

SOCIAL DISEASES CAUSE INDUSTRIAL WASTAGE.

Estimated based on army figures indicate venereal disease ranks high among the factors making for industrial wastage in the United States. A recent article from the statistical department in the American Social Hygiene association summarizes the situation as follows:

Of the 367,485 men in the group known as the "second million" there were 64,843, or 5½ per cent infected with a venereal disease. The annual report of the surgeon general of the army for 1919, in comparing these figures with those for the first 500,000 and first million, says, "It is probable that the figures for the second million of 5½ per cent showed more clearly the correct percentage of the drafted men from civil life who were infected." During the year 1917, gonorrhea was the commonest cause of admission to sick report among soldiers in the United States and in 1918 was second only to influenza. In 1918 syphilis, gonorrhea, and chancroid together were second only to influenza in number of admissions, exceeding by 67,671 admissions bronchitis, the next most frequent cause. Hence, it is evident that, with the exception of the unusual epidemic of influenza which prevailed in 1918, venereal infection was the greatest cause of disability in the army during the world war. The two years 1917 and 1918 witnessed the entrance of approximately 3,500,000 men into the army by induction or voluntary enlistment. In these two years the total time lost to the entire army from venereal disease was 4,255,681 days—2,412,630 days per year. A low estimate of the number of men employed in the United States in manufacturing industries alone today places it at 10,000,000. Based upon the above army figures the yearly time loss through venereal disease in this one group of industries is 6,893,600 days. As for the actual financial loss it cannot be approximated since this would necessitate figuring in the time lost through such complications as gonococcal rheumatism and the various syphilitic conditions, decrease in working activity, and increased liability to accident.

TOO MUCH EDUCATION?

Is there such a thing as too much compulsory education? The president of the Cleveland board of education thinks there can be. He said the other day that while he is sympathetic with those who have fought child labor, he is inclined to believe that in some cases they go too far.


"I think results would be better if we stopped driving the children to school after they are 14 and saw to it that they are properly placed in life. I think much of our so-called compulsory education could be eliminated, and the money used for industrial safeguards for these young persons. In my opinion they would become better developed citizens than if they were kept in school. This I believe, is one answer to the ever-expanding costs of compulsory education. Give education only to those who are capable of receiving it."

This is rather startling doctrine, yet a fairly good case can be made for it.

The child of foreign parents who have always been hand-workers, hardly able to read and write, can seldom assimilate the amount of book-learning which the child of middle-working people can absorb without difficulty. The former can take, and should be given, more than his parents had, but there comes a point beyond which he cannot go to much advantage. To allow him to be idle until he is 18 would be a sad mistake. To keep him in classes where he is unhappy, and where his presence keeps back students who are able to go further, is also undesirable. There are two solutions, work or a different kind of school.

This is where the technical school fills a great need. In cities where they have been established, their opening has had no effect on the academic schools, but a great field hitherto uncharted has been opened. They have been filled to overflowing by children who would never have gone to an academic high school.

There cannot be, apparently, too much education, nor even too much compulsory education. But there can be too much of one kind of school. The field of education grows wider; its possibilities more varied, every year.
