LABOR TAKES CREDIT FOR DISARMAMENT

Samuel Gompers Opens Forty-second Annual Conference of American Federation of Labor With the Statement That the "American Plan" or Open Shop Is Really a Closed Shop

CINCINNATI, O., June 12.—Organized labor is in no mood "to have its head shaved," Samuel Gompers said yesterday from his office in Washington, and "has no objection to any article resembling or assembling of power, no matter whence it shall emanate." Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, declared today in his opening speech at the forty-second annual convention of the federal labor body:
