

LEAGUE PLAYS FOR ARMISTICE FOR EUROPE

Unit System Which Would Make Redirection in Standing Armies. Last Before Commission Which Has Been Working on the Problem for Some Time.

PARIS, July 3.—Plan for the limitation of European armies was submitted to the "darmament" committee of the league of nations by Lord Balfour of England today.

Lord Balfour's scheme, which would reduce the armaments of the nations to the following figures:

- France, 150,000; Poland and Italy, 100,000; England, Greece, Rumania, Japan, Spain and Czechoslovakia, 75,000; Belgium and Switzerland, 60,000.

Lord Balfour's proposal was to appoint a committee to study the plan, and to oversee its operation if the committee is taken, was also proposed.

Additional German, Great Britain, submitted a proposal that the naval disarmament treaty be extended to nations other than those who attended the Washington conference.

Arbitration Proposed by Harding in Coal Strike

WASHINGTON, July 3.—The Harding coal conference today adjourned, until next week, pending a final action on the settlement of the national strike.

This announcement was made by government officials at the conference following a meeting of the opposing factions on the government suggestion that a small arbitration committee be appointed to investigate the situation.

Secretary Davis said he did not carry out his announced plan of suggesting the selection of a small committee composed of both factions to negotiate settlement.

In the absence of this plan the entire body of operators and union leaders will resume their Monday.
