FRANCE TO CUT SIZE OF ARMY TO PAY DEBTS

Exports for First Five Months of This Year Shows Excess of \$100,000,000 Over Imports.

PARIS, July 24.—France is completing the fundamental conditions of her new international economic policy, the government has decided to reduce the size of the army to a considerable figure, and to reduce the size of the navy to a figure which will enable her to share the burden of the maintenance of the world's peace.

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GOVERNMENT MAY OPERATE RAILROADS

President Has Authority to Take Over Mines and Railroads if He Decries to Use Same; Big Orders for Shipment of British Coal to America; Prices Cheap.

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 24.—President Harding has complete power under existing law to take over the mines and the railroads, if he deems such action necessary to keep the mills and interstate commerce moving, it was learned in the highest circle here today.
