What is wrong with America? William Allen White declares' the home life of America has broken down. He tells of young girls, wise beyond their years, disregarding parental warnings and breaking away from restraints. He attributes much of the disturbed condition to the automobile, and the powerful suggestions of the boys, and says the corrective measures must be applied to the home, home.

Undoubtedly Mr. White is right. By attacking the disease on its surface manifestations might give a semblance of improvement which would be false and misleading, but the real cure must be carried to the home.

The Bible tells of the white sepulchres, with outward show of cleanliness, that contain corruption.

It is not for us to whitewash the surface and contemplate the work with such disapprobation. What must be done is to protect the old-fashioned home and home conditions. Until that is done, there will be nothing much accomplished in the way of improving the morals of the young people.

When a young girl becomes so hardened as to disregard all the rules of proper conduct in public, she needs most of all the guidance of mother and the directing of father. Outside the home, the highways are many and the byways are everywhere. Within the home there is the possibility of control. Beyond the threshold, there is endless opportunity for the evasion that guides wayward steps. Close one avenue to folly, and another is opened by a consciousness, which is deadened. Arouse the conscience, re-establish morality, and venial virtue is restored.

After all it is a state of mind, which is never reached by impression and anesthesia furted from the side lines. The heart and the soul must be touched in the communion of the home where hearts bleed and are healed and where souls are saved.—Ogden Standard-Examiner.

A CHINESE SCHEME

It will be interesting to watch the effect as the white man comes in contact with the peculiar and mysterious psychology of the Chinese. They write backwards and to us seem to do everything else the same way.


But they have many ideas worth copying. Ultimately the white race and the yellow race will borrow ideas from each other, and blend their philosophies.

Striking Miners' Families Evicted From Homes




Striking miners at Brownsville and Republic, Pa., have been evicted from their homes by the operators who own the houses. Here miners are removing their household possessions.

TRAPPING THE FLY

Fly-traps have a distinct place in the control of the house fly and other noxious fly species, although the limitations of fly-trap methods are well known.

The Bureau of Entomology, United States Department of Agriculture, points out that the logical method of fly control is to prevent multiplication, by proper attention to breeding places.

The two main ways in which fly-traps are valuable are by catching flies that come to clean premises from insatiable places and by capturing flies that have escaped from other means of destruction. Nearly all fly-traps are made of the same general type, although they may differ in some respects.

The flies are attracted by bait, color, or light, and cage with a large entrance and an exit too small to be easily found, which is often made by using a concealed passage.
