## SHORT LINE SELLS TICKETS TO ALL PLACES ONCE MORE

Further evidence that the general condition of the railroads has improved was registered Thursday after noon when the manager of the short line, Mr. G. Paulson, received a telegram from D. B. Spangler, general passenger agent of the Western Pacific, concerning the resumption of the service of the short line to all points on the Salt Lake route and the Western Pacific, effective at 12 o'clock.

This revoked the orders received last Monday by Smith not to "sell tickets to all places once more" until after the 1st and west of Winnemucco on the Western Pacific. However, tickets are still on sale on the short line, and the short line is due to date, which was ordered at the same time that the sales were discontinued, to resume service on the Salt Lake Route and the Western Pacific. The local officials are expecting the Western Pacific to remove its restrictions.

## SALMON DISTRICTS VOTE MONDAY ON A RURAL HIGH SCHOOL

Electoral returns will be available on Saturday. Report of That Senator Purple Will Otherwise Attend High School Elect.

People living in the eight school districts surrounding Hollister to be decided whether they want to consolidate and form a rural high school. Indications point to show that the people of the various districts in the event that it does not trustee of the Hollister district say they will form a school board.

Records of the county superintendent show that 17 pupils from the Hollister school are now attending schools in other districts at a cost of \$155 per pupil for tuition.

The tuition cost was met by the districts in which the pupils are now attending, and the state law requires districts having no high schools to pay the tuition of pupils who wish to go to schools outside of their districts.

The records also show that 25 pupils will be taught from these districts who are placing going to schools outside of their districts.

A three mill levy will cover the cost of the rural high school, it is said, and the valuation of the Hollister school is \$10,000.

Supporters of the movement to consolidate claim that this will save the taxpayers \$1,000 annually.

It would cost to send students away to school bearing their claims on records, in the county superintendent's office, to receive their credits.

Should the proposition carry, it is intended to have the same courses of study as the Hollister schools, namely, high standards as are given and maintained in the accredited high schools. The citizens of Hollister are asked to vote for the rural high school, however, for students who live some distance from the town, who probably, a voter here, will be in agreement with this view.

The districts affected by this consolidation include: Republic, Ammon, Idaho Falls, Blackfoot, Pocatello, Durkee, Attala, and Hazards.

## MARTIN BARRY

### PASSES AWAY

Well-Known and Popular Green Water Numphoon Last Evening After Long Illness.

Martin Barry, an old resident of Twin Falls, died yesterday at a private residence after a long illness. Mr. Barry had been under treatment for a considerable time.

Winter in Twin Falls in 1901, when the boy was a mere infant in size and age, Mr. Barry is one of its oldest residents. He has been in the city for short periods he has been here ever since. He paid a visit to some of his old friends in Idaho Falls and the return trip was made to the hottest weather of the summer. He was in failing health and expected to die the almost close of his estimate. Since his arrival in Twin Falls Mr. Barry has conducted the Pioneer Inn, which he sold in 1910, and has been very successful in building up a steady business.

Mr. Barry's first son, the light of day in the family, was born in Queenstown, Ireland, on November 18, 1882. This came to America when a young lad and a few years later he became a prominent figure in the French where he conducted a shoe factory.

He came to Idaho in 1888, getting work in the lumber camps in the Sawtooth mountains at a time when the mills that regular men worked in were not built to accommodate more than a dozen men.

The first child to be born in Galena after the birth of Mr. and Mrs. William Galena after the town in which they lived, Mr. Barry, also lived in Galena, and, returning before coming to Twin Falls, he married.

Those surviving the deceased are his wife, Mary Ellen Barry, and four sons, John, Frank, George and Diego, wife, and four daughters, Mrs. Artie, Mrs. Clara, Mrs. Frances, Mrs. Anna, both of Ketchum, and Mrs. D. G. Dusman, widow, who has had a home in Ketchum for many years.
