A LOST OPPORTUNITY

Here is a lesson that the 1922 fair season has taught observant exhibitors: Exhibits should be clearly identified and explained to the visitor.

Strange as it may appear, there was an occasional exhibit even a community display in some cases, on the fair circuit this season without even a card telling where it was or what community it represented. Section, indeed, was there adequate information about the products to help an impression upon his mind as to the quality of the exhibit or the thrift and artistry of the exhibitor.

Did you ever wonder why crowds gather about some exhibits and pass others by with a glance? The chances are they are attracted by a well-labeled sign and telling where display it is, how it was grown, where the seed came from, how the crop compares in value with other crops, and so on. Possibly it is a first class exhibit with a neat card above every animal giving the age, weight, production, size, date, owner, location of ranch and other information of value.

Exhibitors, visitors and fair management are all losers when full information is not given in clear, simple form in connection with fair exhibits. Fair officials should begin right now working out a system of exhibits cards for next year's fair. If properly done it would add real value to the display and greatly increase public interest in the fair.—Idaho Farmer.

GERMANY HAS CREDIT

(By JAMES D. WHELAN.)

The future history will be compiled to disregard much of the wisdom exhibited in this and other countries regarding the financial record being made by Germany. They seem to think a debt contracted when a dollar was worth only a half dollar of what has increased if at maturity it was a burden. If they would appreciate the fact that money is not a measure of value, but an index of relative values, they would see the necessity for maintaining the dollar at as near a stable proportion of all values as possible.

Whereas tell of the danger of "cheap money," the eminent economists of the world of the dollar. They forget the inequity of increasing the purchasing power of the dollar. They seem to think a debt contracted when a dollar was worth only a half dollar of what has increased if at maturity it was a burden. If they would appreciate the fact that money is not a measure of value, but an index of relative values, they would see the necessity for maintaining the dollar at as near a stable proportion of all values as possible.

But is Germany bankrupt? Need we shudder for her, when her industries flourish while the factories of the world go idle? She is bankrupt, of course, but in production of value, of real wealth, and so far as her productive resources are concerned she is leading the world. Only her money is quoted as almost worthless in the world's exchange. But it is good in Germany, and is freely spent there, because rising prices make it a loss to hoard it. But Germany has credit. She recently succeeded in arranging with the Bank of England in conjunction with the Bank of Holland, to bank its issue of treasury notes in lieu of paying out the gold marks demanded by Belgium in settlement of reparations interests to a total of 100,000,000 marks on a gold basis—in other words, securing bank endorsement for a note issue equaling in value at present exchange rates more than ten billions of the paper marks which have furnished Germany the means of keeping alive her industries since the war.

There is food for thought in the bit of diplomacy on the part of the English and Dutch bankers in aiding Germany, for it was good diplomacy as well as safe business.—Dearborn Independent.

Just where will the mark stop if it keeps on depreciating? Ultimately it will go the way of all issues of that sort of currency. It will absolutely wipe out the obligations of the "iron pillars" individuals to creditors and will demoralize money conditions. The Independent does not intimate that the mark will be accepted by the Bank of England or the Bank of Holland. They will be paid as all foreign debts are ultimately paid, in goods.

The Independent is right in denouncing any system which appreciates the currency and makes debts harder to pay. There has been too much of that. Incidentally, a falling of currency, often follows a feast like that in Germany whether it results in a complete obliteration of debts or not.

What is needed is a stable currency. We should have first a system of international internationalism such as that advocated by both political parties and sponsored by the government in 1878, and later endorsed by the republican national convention in 1896. This would mean a temporary increase in the basic money, with a greater stability in supply and less fluctuation. Republicans are rightly advocating this plan.

A better and more scientific system would be one centered about the plan recently outlined by the Standard Oil company, of political economy of Owens College, Manchester, and recently elaborated by J. Laurence Laughlin of Chicago university and Irving Fisher of Yale, which would make it approximately certain that the borrower would have to pay neither more nor less in the products of labor when his debt came due than when it was assumed.

Neither the plan of endless contraction, nor the German "but- tress pit" currency is good or beneficial.

It might also be remarked that the theory promulgated last year that a falling mark would mean increased production has been exploded and that German labor protests more strongly than capital over the falling mark and increased living costs.




