FISCO GETS CONVENTION OF LEGION

Meeting at New Orleans Votes
to Go to Golden Gate for
1923; Gompers and Landis
Talk; Resolutions Demand
Care for the Wounded.

ORLANDO, Oct. 17.—The American Legion convention today voted to hold the 1923 convention in San Francisco, October 16 to 19 inclusive.

The convention approved without discussion the report of its committee on time and place for the next meeting.

Samuel Gompers Speaks

Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor spoke before the convention in favor of a union between the two organizations.

Organized labor and organized employers "should work together," Gompers said, "and establish an understanding between the two groups."

Judge K. M. Lash, high commissioner, also spoke in favor of the convention.

Committees meantime are preparing resolutions on the various areas of the work of the Legion during the year. Resolutions will demand more efficient care for wounded and disabled veterans, better medical service, a more liberal General Service in the hospitalization program, support immigration restrictions, and publicly urge universal suffrage.

Legislative committees will also study the convention.

LODGE AGAIN A FAKER

Senator Lodge must have a poor opinion of New England purchasing agents. Otherwise he would not have dared to address their association with such brazen disregard of the truth as he did on Monday evening.

He was talking about the allied debts and he told his audience that at the recent bankers' convention Mr. Lamont had proposed that we accept good payment of the debts. Mr. Lamont, of course, proposed nothing of the sort. Mr. Lamont simply explained what Senator Lodge knows as well as anybody else, that an international debt of eleven billions cannot be paid in gold and that there is only one way that it could conceivably be paid—namely, by the export of goods.

Senator Lodge naturally does not like this fact. As a high priest of super-protection and a politician interested in protecting the whole of the allied debts can be collected; it was impossible for him to state the obvious. There is no honest way of supporting both the Forney-McCumber tariff and the collection of the debts. The two propositions are mutually destructive. Senator Lodge knows this. But in a campaign he pretends not to know it. He is as dishonest about the debts as he was about the League and the banks—New York World.

Even if there were eleven billion dollars in gold coin in the world and it were all dumped into our laps at once, the debt would be all paid in golds, nevertheless. For prices here would all go up; except articles like wheat, of which we have a surplus. Gold prices abroad would drop to nothing. High prices would make foreigners eager to sell to us and unless we should erect a positive embargo on everything and maintain a great fleet to enforce it, goods would come in and gold would go out. Under a bi-metallic system, fewer goods would come in, because it would take a smaller proportion of the metallic money stock to pay the debt, and an equilibrium would be reached sooner. This is the principle laid down by great bi-metallic economists like Francis A. Walker.

So far as the products of which we have a large surplus to export are concerned, the rousing up of all the gold in the world here, and the raising of no embargo against manufactured goods, would cripple the industry, since the foreigner would have nothing which we would take, to offer for our products. He would have to adjust his needs to the situation and so would we which would mean that enough of our farmers would be driven out of business to reduce our surplus to nothing. All this is absolutely in accord with the principles of orthodox, classical political economy.—J. D. W.
