

TURKS NOT GOVERNED BY SULTAN'S REGIME

Angora Government Announces That It Is Capable of Handling Own Affairs; Britain, Angered by Attitude of Turks, Begins Preliminary Preparations for Possible Warfare.

ANKARA, Nov. 10.—British and French troops occupying the regions bordering on Constantinople today, according to reports reaching here this afternoon.
