count the sheep and stated that this would be a good time to do so because farmers and business men had originated with John W. Graham.

C. E. McDaniel was introduced as one of the prominent farmers of this tract and spoke briefly on the farmers' problems. He said that we have not reached the zenith of our ability as farmers. The farmers of Modavia, he said, are the best educated in the 200 worth of dairy products. The poultry industry, the beef and lamb industry and the sheep industry are continually increasing. # SAWYER TEST CASE BEFORE HIGH COURT

Supreme Tribunal Will Pass on Validity of Law Enacted by the Legislature of 1919; Is of Great Interest to Medical Circle of Gem State.

The case of the State of Idaho against H. W. Sawyer is to be heard in the supreme court at Pocatello on Wednesday, Nov. 15. It is a question of an osteopathic physician's right to practice medicine, to perform a surgical operation under his license, as an osteopath.

The osteopaths contend the statute very much interferes in the case and the president of the osteopathic physicians and surgeons organization, Dr. E. M. Peabody, of Nampa, will be in attendance at the court with a delegation from both the state and city.

Dr. A. McCauley of Idaho Falls vice-president and an osteopathic specialist in diseases of the eye, ear, nose and throat, and Dr. J. E. Peabody, of Nampa, will be in attendance together with a delegation from both the state and city.

The osteopaths of Twin Falls also intend to be represented, headed by Dr. Luis C. Sawyer.

The osteopaths contend that it is an unjust discrimination against them.

Mr. Sawyer, president of the medical society, has been making strenuous efforts when their school quietly tries to do so. They give him a list of osteopathic charges for placement in the program of the Gem State United States located at Cheyenne, Kansas City, Los Angeles, Kirkville and Portland.

Attorneys E. V. Larson and W. W. Wolf of the city are going to Roanoke to present the case for the delegation, according to Dr. Peabody. Dick will present the case for the state.

Partie in Case

Dr. Sawyer arrived in 1920 in this city for the alleged violation of the statute of 1919 forbidding the practice of medicine and surgery by osteopaths. Specifically he is charged that he had performed an operation for appendicitis, which it is claimed was appendicitis, and had performed surgery, which it is asserted his license to practice osteopathy does not cover. Dr. Sawyer claims that he has been compelled to leave the city under that head. He also attacked the law on the grounds of unconstitutional discrimination.

He was arrested in October, 1920, and was freed after trial and costs.
