Congress and the Whole Government Mourned - Blood Still Today in Honor of the Funeral of James H. Mann, Congressman from Illinois for Over 23 Years.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—The wheels of the government still turn this afternoon as the highest officials of the nation joined with congress in paying tribute to the memory of the late Representative James H. Mann of Chicago, in general service to the country, to the house of representatives.

The services were held at the veterans' institution, for 23 successive years a member of the house and for years a fervent republican leader, and the speaker of the house presided over the services.

RICH OIL FIND EXPECTED IN THE FAR WEST

Geologists believe that at the Four Corners of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah and Arizona a Great Oil Dome is Located.

DENVER, Dec. 2.—A new oil field which geologists believe will exceed the famous Denver oil field of Arizona is expected to be found in the Four Corners, where the states of Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona and Utah join, according to officials of the general land office here of the department of the interior.

The interior department already has said that the oil field is located in the Navajo Indian reservation in northwestern New Mexico, following a conference of geologists and oil experts held yesterday.

There has been a great scramble for "advantageous territory" in the new field, and enormous large and small oil companies are engaged in making minute examinations of the territory available.

Officials of the interior department said yesterday that the oil field may be known as "a riding in Smyrna following the expulsion of Greeks." Intriguingly, they declared.



Why does a person "knock wood" when he does not want his luck to desert him?

It is believed to originate from the old Danish myth, says Lund Antonius.

This belief was that as there were so many冥信ions of their kind in the timbers of the ship, the ripples of the wood would come out and bless the ship and insure it a safe return.

Knowledge and experience are working capital to an individual, just as surely as money in the bank. With \$10,000 and no experience, the average man going into business for himself, is more apt to go broke than make a success.

Knowledge and experience are even more important than money. To get them costs money.

Obviously, Ford is not suggesting that we go out and fling our money to the four winds. Observe that he says, spend ON YOURSELF. What to buy? Good books, education, travel that brings knowledge.

Fort himself is 50. He was nearly 40 before he began giving much thought to building up a fortune. Previously to that, he had been busy—spending his money, experimenting and increasing his fund of information.

He didn't spend on foolish amusement, billfings, baseball betting, racing and clothes beyond his means. He invested his dollars in increasing his mechanical knowledge, in developing a definite campaign of action in a certain industry, and in acquiring the knowledge of human nature necessary to enable him to market his product, Ford cars.

Now he is "earning in" on that early investment in himself. Indirectly he had always been saving and accumulating.

The thing to guard against is "spending on ourselves" in the wrong way.
