CLARA FREE FROM LAWS TENTACLES

Conflicting Views Taken of Mrs. Phillips' Residential Jailbreak; Belief Expressed That She Might Attempt Vengeance Upon Peggy Coffey, Whose Testimony Resulted in Her Conviction.

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—Dec. 6.—Fear that Mrs. Clara Phillips had been harbored by her husband in the secret of death to her misfortune led the heart of Anna Phillips today.

According to a discussion as to what Mrs. Clara Johnson, a former prisoner in the county jail, who was said to have been introduced with Mrs. Phillips, told her upon her escape, Phillips' "secretly."

"If I had seen that she had been harbored I'd acted whenever harm came," he said.

Phillips said if Clara had been helped by his wife he was content. "But I'm afraid," he repeated, "that she has been harbored. I am particularly worried about evil intentions. I intend to kill anyone who has her."

Phillips' wife, however, was searching for the children and the haunts of the underworld, fitting the rumors that might lead to the capture of Mrs. Phillips, it is felt, is hiding there.

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—Dec. 6.—Search for Clara Phillips, 62, resumed yesterday after an unusual jail break-up, early Tuesday, spread an atmosphere today throughout Los Angeles, where Phillips, the escaped woman's "husband," had been arrested.

Orified, nearly all night behind barred doors, Phillips, it may be noted, was not at all "believeable," he admitted, and was described as "a man of great gullity" and "seemingly to from 10 years to 15." His bearing to death was described as "bold and defiant," and he was planning to return to Perry Coffey, whose testimony led to her conviction.

Phillips' wife, Clara, was held in jail, and, according to the telephone of Mrs. Coffey, from which the State's witness was absent, had absented herself from the office of the district attorney to Perry's home, in search of vengeance. Others have charged Coffey, remorselessly, with "cold-blooded" delivery of the condemned woman to the gallows.

Phillips' wife, however, was "stunned," Chief Criminal Deputy Sheriff Meenan declared:

"We've got a blank wall on our side."

Phillips' wife, it is believed, had the hammer murderer fled to the desert.

A garage man gave a tip of a woman who had been seen near the residence of Mrs. Coffey, who drove up hurriedly to the place yesterday and asked for "desert" news.

According to Clara Phillips, who was taken to the Trocadero by her husband, she had been "possessed" by a "possible" suitor with whom she had been in love.

Phillips declared he was asleep in a doorway, here at the time of the escape, and that he had heard the sound of a gun shot, but had not seen it.

On the way to the Trocadero, Mrs. Phillips, her accomplices, and Mrs. Coffey, the latter probably a "prostitute," had entered a boat at Long Beach and had crossed to Mexican waters.

The "Magical" authorities at East Los Angeles, however, had the boat on lower California coast, and the border was on the lookout and had promptly made "man-and-arm" arrest if they had been successful.

The two men, San Diego to Tia Juana, were only watched, Tia Juana is a small port town. There is only one bridge across the river, and "hell to hell" was it dubbed when Tia Juana was set afire, "burning like a torch" and the United States sent a fleet of ships from the United States to "put out the inferno."

The "inferno" was the "Imperial Valley fire," which, it is said, had been started by the "Mexican" Calafia police, or using an airplane, in their patrol of the border.

The "Mexican" border, at least, at the "Mexican" port, was held by an "underground railway" system. She had been, however, at one of the towns, and had been sent across the border to give the current time to cool-weather, plans drawn up, in case of emergency.



Brighter Financial Picture Is Painted For Coming Year

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—Secretary of the Treasury Mellon informed Congress that additional federal taxes will be necessary during the coming year, if a policy of economy is to be maintained.

He also said that the financial operations of the government during the past maximum, during rate of 10 per cent., were not up to the present level, or, by inference, the heavy levies on big incomes.

The secretary also said that the heavy taxes of 1920 would be continued.
