## ELECTION OF LODGE NOW QUESTIONED

**Liberal-Baptist League of Massachusetts File Protest Will Go to Senate Committee and May Be Lost.**

**WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 14.—** Protest against validity of the election of Harry Cabot Lodge was presented to the Senate yesterday by Vice-President Coolidge, who ordered that they be "tabled until further notice."

The protest, which was made by the Massachusetts delegation, was signed by Rep. John A. Nichols, defeated "progressive" candidate for senator; probably, it should be noted, specifically demanded a candidate withdrawn immediately from the Senate race, and taken into the protest until after they are referred to the proper committee, which would be done.

On the protest, until the new session of Congress, March 4, "an amendment will be introduced in the new committee," said the new committee.

## CONGRESS ASKS HARDING TO CALL 2ND PEACE PARLEY

**WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—**The house expressed presidential approval of suggestion that President Harding call a second international conference with the view of uniting the construction of armaments, arbitration and disarmament.

By the overwhelming vote of 281 to 6, the house adopted a resolution calling for a second international conference to settle the naval armament question.

Under the bill, the president can call a conference to a final

vote when the house votes on the navy bill Monday.

The Senate will vote on the proposed special appropriation of \$40,000,000 for new armament.

Enforcement of the ordinance against the "hooky-hoboe" pastime is commendable. The practice, formerly comparatively innocent, has become extremely dangerous with the advent of the auto.

The attempt to return to the old two-party system failed in this election. Six or seven years of coalition are not yet wiped out in four weeks. Because the initiators of the modern eastern dances made a hush job of the proceedings, Commissioner J. E. Roberts insisted that the old-time dance "like mother used to make" was good enough for this city. The commissioner said that about 97 per cent of the dances were keeping time with the music without improper actions, but 4 per cent had put the line of decentum, in various degrees. He says that folks come back from the east with a dance that is capable of being danced without impropriety, but which tends itself to improper uses for those so inclined. Some take advantage of this where permitted. Hence, he called a halt on it. Since then the dance halls beginning with Dandemond, have clamped down the "let's-on-all such-manifestations, which, as stated, were quite rare. This does not mean that modern dances of a proper kind may not be indulged in. It is necessary to put on the Virginia reel, or the quadrille. It will not be incompatible for society writers to say that "a good time was had," that folks "tripped the light fantastic toe," or that "terpsichorean activities were indulged in." All that the dance hall proprietors agree by the new ruling is that in every instance decency shall be observed.
