**HABIT CLINICS
TO CURE CRIME**

BOSTON, Jan. 8.—"Fight the crime wave exactly as we fight disease epidemics," is the answer of Dr. L. Vernon Briggs, famous criminologist, to the problem of increasing murder and lesser crime in America.

Dr. Briggs, author of "The Man of Man That Kills," director of the Massachusetts Society for Mental Hygiene, and member of the National Committee of Criminal Law and Criminology, made these recommendations:

Abolish capital punishment.
Establish "habit clinics" in every state between two and seven to prevent possible future criminality.

Dr. Briggs says punishment cannot stop crime because it doesn't remove the criminal from society.

He cites the case of a man of Boston, established seven months ago under Dr. Thorne, the only one directed toward preventing crime from the inside of it.

Kill Disease, Not Patient.

When we fight typhoid, tuberculosis, yellow fever and similar diseases, we do not try to kill the people afflicted and destroy the germs and every bit of evidence about them. Instead we study the disease, isolate it, treat it, cure it, so that will cure. Science strives to kill the disease, not the patient.

"We can't treat crime that way."

RADIO FUTURE

A New York city department store has just sold 350 "Western Electric receiving and broadcasting stations" at \$495 apiece.

This was at a special sale. The outfitts are described as "Built for the U. S. Navy." Adopted by the U. S. government as standard. Now in successful use on government ships. Sets that have never been used."

This sale is a history-making event.

It is the forerunner of best-grade radio at low price. The ad offering these sets for \$495 says "the estimated cost of producing these sets today is \$1,065, and the estimate is conservative."

The production cost, however, will be reduced eventually. Cheap radio of the best grade is inevitable. Remember, watches were almost prohibitive in price to the average man until Ingersoll set out to make them for a dollar. So were radios, until Henry Ford put on his thinking-cap.

Another prophetic vision of radio's future comes from Weller, Mass., where Roger Baldwin, business expert, backs a movement to build a "wireless community church."

In this church, at different hours each Sunday, religious services for all denominations will be conducted by radio.

For instance, Baptists would get their service 10 to 11 in the morning; they would follow hours for Methodists, etc.

What Baldwin has in mind is eventually a national radio service by which isolated communities will get the best music and the best preaching available.

The services will be picked up in the homes by other millions of people, when high-grade radio outfitts become cheap.

Consideration by local growers, marketing and selling the crop of beets was among the most profitable of all farm activities last year; that the field was large; the quality fine; the market good; and the price good, the growth in some quarters during the previous year had been ploughed, and the beet raising everywhere suffered.

The growerly sentiment in favor of diversified farming was also manifested in the discussions on the subject and in calling for the growing of a fair proportion of beets in the various neighborhoods would keep all the Idaho factories running at full capacity, and would be ideal for the making of sugar. The freight situation and the difficulties of getting cars for bulky products when needed were also considered.
