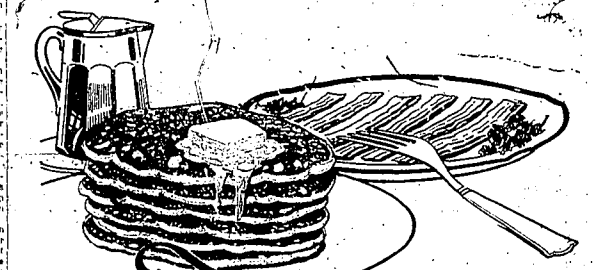

This paper has refrained from taking a very active part in the controversy concerning the American Falls reservoir project because we have felt that every progressive citizen should come out for this project because the future of this city and community depends so much on the establishment of the project.

AGRICULTURE NEGLECTED

Property is proclaimed for every branch of industry except agriculture. A picture is thus presented of a great economic structure erected without any substantial foundation.

The fact that a primary division of commerce is required to maintain the burden of our retarded reconstruction is evidence that our economic system has been damaged by governmental restrictions.

Under this law the interstate commerce commission is able to shift the burden of deflation on agriculture by the manipulation of classified freight rates while it pretends to apply a principle of utilities regulation.

As far as the Twin Falls district is concerned an equitable adjustment of freight rates on the basis of cost of production and the cost transportation would quickly return our prosperity which is now inhibited by perverted principles of economics.

A cross-section of Twin Falls district conditions demonstrates no demand for special laws for the farmer. An equitable interpretation of the present financial regulations would restore credit to amply support the agricultural interests through existing agencies.

### LESSON FOR JANUARY 7

**JESUS HEALING ON THE SABBATH**  
 LESSON TEXT—LUKE 13:10-17.  
 GOLDEN TEXT—It is lawful to do well on the Sabbath Day. (LUKE 13:16.)  
 INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR TOPIC—YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULT TOPIC—THE SABBATH DAY.

What Jesus did on the Sabbath frequently brought him into serious conflict with the Pharisees. Through the petty rules and regulations they had made this holy day, which God designed as a day of rest and the doing of deeds of mercy, a day of burden and hardship. Jesus did not disregard the Sabbath, but broke away from their traditions and showed that the Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath. Religious rites and ceremonies should not be heaped upon it to bind the worshiper.

**I. Jesus Teaching on the Sabbath Day (v. 10).**  
 It was the Lord's custom to go to the synagogue on the Sabbath. His disciples will imitate Him in this. At the place of worship there is opportunity to be nearest to God, to worship Him, and to show mercy and kindness to our fellow-men.

**II. Jesus Healing on the Sabbath (v. 11).**  
 A Woman in Need (v. 11). This poor woman's back was bowed down with eighteen years of great suffering. They thus collected the way for her way to the place of worship. Men and women are in great need today. Their bodies may not be bowed down with physical suffering, but there are many bowed down with the burden of sin and sorrow.

**3. Called to Jesus (v. 12).** He is always quick to discern those who are hindered. He spoke a word of healing to her. How welcome must have been His words. He is calling today to the many who are weighed down with guilty consciences to come to Him.

**4. Lord Hims Upon Her (v. 13).** At the touch, she was made free. Christ's love is enough to heal. He showed His sympathy by coming into touch with the sufferer. Christ's followers are to imitate Him in teaching, and also in coming into direct touch with the needy, sinful, and burdened world.

**5. The Salvation of the Ruler of the Synagogue (v. 14).**  
 Under the plea pretense of loyalty to God he showed that ritual is of more importance than mercy and love. It was not primarily concern for ritual, but hatred for Jesus that moved him to indignation. He was too covetous to attack the Lord directly, so turned in the people and hit at Him over their backs. He pretended great concern for the healing of the people but advised that they come in the six days, and not this, have the Sabbath profaned by such sacrilegious act as the healing of this poor woman. This was the type of the many hypocrites among us today.

**6. The Lord's Reply to the Ruler (v. 15, 16).**  
 Jesus removes the mask of hypocrisy from the ruler as He points out their own custom as a condemnation of their pious pretense. He accuses from the text to the ruler. It was right to take animals which had only been tied for a few hours, to enter on the Sabbath day, certainly it was right to bring relief to this woman who had been bowed for eighteen years. Human beings are of more value than animals. This woman was a daughter of Abraham and not a sinner of low-down character. The principle which Jesus set forth restored the Sabbath to its true purpose.

**7. Shamed Adversaries and Rejoicing People (v. 17).**  
 The title was now turned. Their exposure was so great that their consciences smote. The arguments against morals and the church are of the same type today.

CATTLEMEN TO MEET IN BOISE JAN. 26, 27TH

Many Subjects Including Legislation, Finance and Insurance Will Be Considered at the Gathering in Neighborly Session Planned.

MAKAY, Idaho, Jan. 12.—The eighth annual convention of the Idaho Cattle and Horse Growers' Association will be held in Boise, Friday and Saturday, January 26 and 27, according to a call sent out by the association today.

The program embraces the following stated subjects for consideration: 1. Minimum state land grazing fee.

2. Reduction, rather than increase in forest grazing fee.

3. Effect of policy of war finance loan boards on cattle industry.

4. The assessed valuation of cattle.

5. The predatory animal form on cattle.

6. Publication, in book form, of all brands recorded, for distribution to state county precinct, forest officials and to cattle breeders and growers.

7. A legislative program embracing a Coten or farm law.

8. Freight rates.

9. The marketing of calves.

There are also 2000 men engaged in the breeding, growing and packing of beef cattle in Idaho state, most of all of which are in the portion of the time on forest reserves and on unoccupied lands.

There are 23 local livestock associations in good standing with headquarters in good standing with headquarters of a community to organize for the purpose of co-operation and meet the working out of beneficial policies.

It is estimated that there is 325,000,000 invested in cattle in the beef type in this state. The cattle value held by the growers will run into many millions, making Idaho's foremost industry.

This industry's status, Len Dillingham, secretary-treasurer of the state association, "has been the

hardest hit of all Idaho industries. Everyone has been saying they want to do something for the cattlemen but it has not been until the annual convention to give ample opportunity for assistance. The cattlemen know what will put the industry back on a paying basis. A system must be developed whereby there is some difference between the amount of costs to grow a steer and the price for which it is sold. The grower has very little say about the price he receives, but he should have something to say about the costs of production. The cost of production must be set. This cannot be done by advancing the grazing fee on the forest, but the cost of production is worth on state lands and allowing the breeding stock to remain in the actual hand value, when almost all other property in the state is assessed for about one-half and in many instances less than one-half, to as low as one-third.

"The cost of production can be advanced by the enactment of legislation which will cover the amount that will throw around it some safeguards. For instance \$25,000 any grower who charges more than the cost of beef cattle by itself alone.

"With strong state associations in the foreground, the industry, working with the national organization, eventually something will be done on the marketing of the business, but just now, as a matter of cost, direct and indirect benefits, a certain amount of protection must be had, before even the cost of production is met, to say nothing of the amount of production which the grower must come if the great industry is to be continued in Idaho and the West.

Speaking of the monopolization of the association in the past Secretary Dillingham said: "The state association has kept down grazing fees on the forests; it has had the payments postponed in times of stress; it has had the assessed valuation of cattle reduced from \$30 to \$20; it has cooperated with the railroad for a better car distribution; it has advocated and conferred with forest officials on beneficial changes on the reserves, which has favored legislation needed in the state to benefit the industry in general; it has fought range cases in the supreme court of the United States; it has prosecuted cattle thieves and sent them to the penitentiary."

The association is organized by districts, embracing one or more counties. Each county has a committee, and each district a member of the advisory board.
