Drastic Measures Used By France

Ruhr Coal Mines Are Requisitioned by Franco-Belgians to Enforce Reparations from Germany; Coal and Food Shortage Predicted for Parts of German Empire.

BERLIN, Feb. 1.—Drastic and severe repression of German resistance in the Ruhr and Rhineland marked the first series of Franco-Belgian measures to enforce reparations today. Forty more Ruhr officials were ordered expelled, including the burgomasters of Herne and Cleve.

Requisitioning of coal mines was started by French troops at Bochum. Two officials who protested were arrested. The German miners strike in reprisal, whereupon troops cleared the Westphalian and Sauerland.

The whole attitude of the invaders was reported as more severe than hitherto.

ROBINSON IS GIVEN THIRD IN NET RANK

Twin Falls Man Wins High Place in List of Intermountain Tennis Stars by Association; Two-man Event Goes to Robinson and Garnett.

A report of the United States Lawn Tennis association for 1922 published in American Lawn Tennis magazine, placed Howard W. Robinson of Twin Falls number 3 for the Intermountain section, with only Ned Garnett of Salt Lake and H. P. Hoover of Denver, another champion, ahead of him. Robinson and Garnett are given the preliminary position in the doubles.

Robinson played his best tennis through the excellent showing last year in the Intermountain tournament at Salt Lake where he lost to Coleman in the semi-finals. Paired with Garnett, Robinson captured the doubles event which was held along with the singles on the fine clay courts of the Salt Lake Tennis club.

Most of the outstanding players ranked are from Salt Lake, however, hailing from Provo, Logan and other Utah points which put strong contestants in the field. Garnett, Utah and Intermountain champion, as expected, led the field, having to be credited a tie four set single victory over Coleman in the Intermountain final last year.

Robinson is the present holder of the Idaho state championship which he acquired at Boise in 1922 without the loss of a set. Philip Heston, the California marvel, who won the honor at Pocatello the year before, did not complete and few of the Spokane or other northwest players were entered in the competition. Thus it was almost a southern Idaho event.

With tennis rapidly coming to the fore and the prediction advanced that 1923 will top all former years in the interest of the numerous clubs in the Intermountain and northwest states, the coming season and numerous events are not to lure the net man to neighboring states.

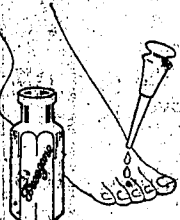
