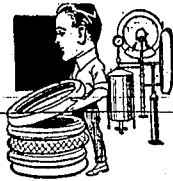

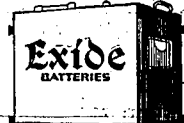

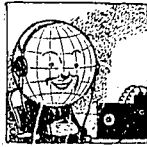

AVERITT AND STATE WAREHOUSES

(By JAMES D. WHELAN.)

The proposal of W. D. Averitt in this issue that the state should build a large warehouse in Idaho at a central point and establish state-owned dehydrating plants at various points to dry fruit and vegetables of which there is a surplus, to be held over until lean years, is interesting.

It is true that public warehouses are enumerated as public utilities under the Idaho law, and when connected with railroads are clearly by reason of such proximity, economically within that line.

In this connection, however, it is well to call attention to the fact that the construction of warehouses in Idaho by the state seems clearly prohibited by the constitution of the state itself.

Two years ago at Idaho Falls, Attorney Cummings of Pocatello, who, as Non-partisan endorser, had been candidate on the democratic ticket for attorney general two years before, appeared with a tentative plank for state-owned warehouses.

At Idaho the matter was presented by Attorney Henry Hall of Jerome, who, however, conceded that its constitutionality was questionable.

Now, there is no use in passing on unconstitutionality. If the people really want to try this experiment they should have the opportunity.

There is now pending in the legislature a bill to give life to the initiative, referendum and recall provisions of the constitution.

Should they vote for the constitutional amendment and vote down the advisory initiated measure, the legislature would know that the people wanted power to build warehouses if desired but did not care to exercise that right at once.

Anyhow, anybody who wants state-owned warehouses ought to begin by clearing ground and working for the submission of an amendment to the constitution.
