

ROBBERS HAVE BIG RING

One Hundred Thousand Dollars Worth of Currency Stolen from Denver Mint Circulating in St. Paul; Gigantic Swindling Gang is Disclosed; They Deal in Bonds and Stolen Goods.

ST. PAUL, Minn., Feb. 17.—New arrests impeded today in connection with postal and mint robberies involving millions in very big profits and cash.

Federal postoffice inspectors who obtained information against 27 Twin City bankers and bond brokers last night, disclosed that they have secured evidence which indicates that \$100,000 worth of stolen bonds into the northwest last fall.

Circulation here of more than \$100,000 worth of currency said to have been stolen in the Denver mint robbery last December, is reported to have brought about the discovery of leaders in the syndicate.

Hundreds of Mint Bills Out. Hundreds of \$5 bills stolen in the Denver mint robbery were in circulation here the last few days.

This band is understood to link up with the activities of an alleged gang of "robbers" which officials believed they had broken up with the arrest of 23 men in St. Paul and Minneapolis last fall.

CINCINNATI, O., Feb. 17.—The government has recovered \$80,000 identified as part of currency stolen from a \$100,000 Denver mint robbery of two months ago, officials said today when details of a scheme to aid members of a criminal gang to open a house for bank and mail robbers' work were made public.

Recovery of \$100,000 more in negotiable bonds and securities, in packed and postal robberies, is expected.

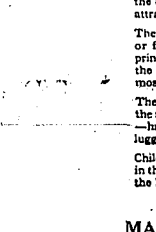
