The Boy Scout has received splendid co-operation from the Twin Falls Rotary and Kiwanis clubs. Each club gave \$100 to this splendid movement for the development of better men.

It is almost a self-evident fact that the farmer in Southern Idaho who gets the most out of his farm is the fellow who makes the most complete use, without waste, of what is produced on the soil.

Some time ago a speaker made the following remark to a Twin Falls audience: "The weakest link in our economic chain is the lack of livestock on our farms." If we as citizens of the Twin Falls tract will solve this problem we will be performing a real public service which will prove a lasting benefit to this community.

If any doubt remains that there is no case for the Bureau bill, to take away the established rights of the Pueblo Indians in the interest of white squatters, Secretary Fall's statement relating to it will tend to remove the doubt. He fears for the safety of democratic government if such propaganda is allowed to go unchecked as has been carried on by the chairman of the Indian section of the general Federation of Women's clubs against this bill.

The Twin Falls city administration has unpaid warrants out amounting to about \$75,000 and these warrants are drawing interest at the rate of 7 per cent. The city now proposes to draw interest on the indebtedness by the issuance of bonds in this amount.

THE MODEST GREATNESS OF WASHINGTON

Like really great men, Washington was extremely modest. He depended solely on his simple honesty of purpose and on his unostentatious virtues to give him the reward which he deserved. Deeply religious he avoided the pomposity of the Pharisee. Profoundly patriotic he never paraded his devotion to country; he simply served. Contemporary writers say that nobody unfamiliar with his record would know from anything that he ever said, that he was the great soldier and statesman who had piloted the country through war and through the dangerous days of early independence.

No man was better fitted than Washington to bear the title of "Father of His Country." His advice was sage and fatherly. Its substance was such as would hold good in all times. In detail much would have to be modified and no man would have been more ready than he to change mere policy to meet the newer needs. In early youth and until the eve of the revolution a devoted and loyal subject of Great Britain, he was ready when the necessity arose to pledge his life and honor and all he possessed to his country and to that separation by which alone the rights of the nation could be secured.
