DUSSELDORF, Feb. 27.—Rust—mile upon mile, a rusted network of railways, roundhouses filled with rusted locomotives, cars with rusted wheels on silent sidings-that is the most striking, the most toll-tale evidence of the success or failure of the occupation of the Ruhr. It is more informative than any official interview or statistics.

On an automobile ride through a dozen or more Ruhr towns, I observed the extension of the red rust which marks the creeping paralysis overcoming the nervous system of the great industrial organism. One by one the tall smokestacks everywhere hedging the horizon are ceasing to smoke as the paralysis reaches them.

Already 50,000 persons are idle in the Ruhr valley and their number will increase from now on in a growing ratio. Hundreds of thousands of others are engaged in non-productive work. Raw materials and stocks are fast diminishing, meaning that the factories must soon shut down.



Incipient first having their origin within the building almost always will be extinguished by automatic sprinklers if they are properly maintained. Since its perfection the automatic sprinkler has conquered, in the early stages, many thomsands of fires. The fact that a valve has been known sometimes to leak where sprinkle-lers have been installed in wards is not sufficient reason for neglecting to inditute this precaution, although many hospital authorities have given this occasional defect as an excuse for non-installation.

There is no doubt that the average hospital should be protected by s\(\text{pfinklers}\). They are desirable, as an added safeguard, even in those structures which are believed to be fully fire-resistive. Since the sprinkler system also can function as an auxiliary fire since are springer system area can junction as an auxiliary tre-alarm, when so equipped, its value is twenfolt; it indicates the loca-tion of the fire and instantly sets about quenching the blaze.
