That this government renounce its policy of isolation from international affairs and assume full share of the responsibility in the settlement of international problems.

U. S. Should Sacrifice Debts. As another step toward European tranquility, this government should agree to make good on its debts in the matter of debts, the call stated.

(Copyright 1923, by United Press.) DUESSELDORF, Feb. 27.—But—miles upon miles, a rusted network of railways, roundhouses filled with rusted locomotives, cars with rusted wheels on silent sidings—that is the most striding, the most toll-tale evidence of the success or failure of the occupation of the Ruhr. It is more informative than any official interview or statistics.

On an automobile ride through a dozen or more Ruhr towns, I observed the extension of the red rust which marks the creeping paralysis overcoming the nervous system of the great industrial organism.

Already 50,000 persons are idle in the Ruhr valley and their number will increase from now on in a growing ratio. Hundreds of thousands of others are engaged in non-productive work. Raw materials and stocks are fast diminishing, meaning that the factories must soon shut down.

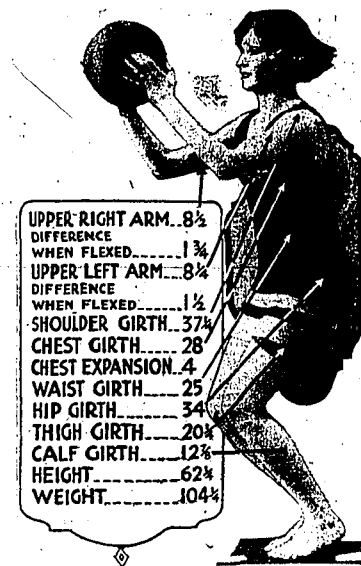

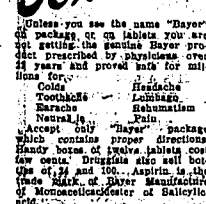
