### MALNUTRITION A SERIOUS PROBLEM

At least 20 and, according to some estimates, possibly 33 pe cent of the school children of the United States are suffering from malnutrition, as general physical underdevelopment is commonly designated, says the advisory committee on foods and antirition of the National Child Health Comeil in a report that will soon be published by the U. S. Public Health Service, which co-operated in its preparation.

Malnutrition, continues the report, is not confined to any one

Manutration, continues the report, is not confined to any one class or race; it some eities it is apparently as prevalent in the homes of the well to do than in those of persons of more limited means. The condition is evidenced, not only by weight and growth records but also by listlessness, lack of color, duffness, and sometimes by restlessness and irritability.

-It is due chiefly to physical defects, faulty labits, or environment of the highest of the highest of the mean content of the highest of the label and an architecture factor.

Of physical defects the most common are destructions (ade, for instance) in the nose or throat, which interfere with breathing; and decayed teeth, which breed germs and interfere with chowing. When such defects are remodied many children will de-

Faulty food and health habits are also important causes of uninutrition. They include too little load, the wrong kind of food, and bad food labits, whether due to ignorance, poverty, or lack of home discipline: and also faulty posture in standing, sitting, or walking, all of which interfere with the normal functioning of important organs of the body. Such habits can be corrected by proper exercises, which, however, should be carefully controlled as otherwise they may prove harmful.

Environmental conditions, which interfere with sufficient sleep lack of fresh air, and even constant magging may cause under-development and their correction may result in remarkable gains.

Cases of malnutrition that do no not yield to simpler orrective measures may required prolonged medical supervision; and, in any measures may required prolonged undical supervision; and, in any event, preventive measures are much better than curative ones. Health education in the schools will go a long way toward preventing findhitrition, not only in the pupils themselves but will also, if the results are brought energically to the attention of parents, usually react to the benefit of younger children of preschool age. And the younger the child the more easily are properhealth habits learned and the inner valuable they are.

Health education may also be spread by well qualified speakers, by magazine articles, moving pictures, by alth plays, and exhibits that vividly bring home the results of undunfillion and the often amuzing improvements derived from corrective measures.
