ENGINEER OF CONTACT LINE IN THE CITY

Representative of Mining Company That Expects to Put Power into Owyhee Center Arrives but is Reluctant as to Plans; President Cardwell is Not Here.

The promised visit of the chief engineer of the public interest in which William Cardwell of Oklahoma City, capital, in president and which has been featuring an building a power line to Contact, became a reality last evening when Dr. E. C. Kelly arrived in this city from Contact at the Perrine. Engineer Kelly modestly signed his place of residence as a "City," which may have meant that this will be his future residence.

Is Not Communicative. A Times representative called him up early this morning at his room in the Perrine and the following remarks were made: "This is a Times reporter; may I have a talk with you?" "No, I am with you here." "May I see you later, say at 10 o'clock?" "Well, then, may I ask you a few questions over the phone now? There is nothing wrong about asking questions?" "No," he said, "I am here in connection with the development of the power line from this city to Contact."

"Oh," replied the engineer, "I cannot talk about this." "You mean that you have nothing to say?" "Yes, President Cardwell here?" "No." "And this ended the conversation. Will probably survey. It has been stated quite emphatically by those in contact with the mining interests in question that a survey would be made as soon as the roads to Contact were open and they are now open. It has also been stated that the engineering crew of part thereof used by the Idaho Central in connection with the line from Wells to Hogerson would be used as far as this survey had been completed.

Some time ago President Cardwell wrote here asking for information about the roads to Contact, saying that engineers would arrive as soon as they were. Information that was given by Manager Theodor, secretary of the Idaho Power company, said this morning that he had not been informed of the arrival of Engineer McCully, adding that he was going out of town and would be back in the afternoon. President Cardwell has repeatedly stated that the building of the power line would be continued on the assurance that a road would be constructed to the mines. The law always been in close communication with President Conrad Wolfe of the Idaho Central.

McArdle Retires. W. T. McArdle, veteran Contact mining man and connected also with the Riverside Mining company at which Cardwell is local, retired today when interviewed by the Times, he said enthusiastically "Oh, he'll be here and smiled but declined to say more. BIG DISTRICT DIRECTORS ARE HOLDING MEET

Negotiations with Government Representatives Are Progressing in Regard to Contract; Prosperity in Sight as Result, Says Fleener.

Negotiations for the formation of the contract between the big irrigation district and the government of the United States is taking up a great deal of the time before the board of directors today. R. E. Stottenson, who here representing the reconstruction service of the government. He arrived with President H. E. Shepler, shortly after 10 o'clock. Mr. Fleener, secretary of the Reclamation association, is here from Boise. Appropriation is ready. "Should the district call a election and get it over before May 1," said Mr. Fleener.
