CONGRESSMAN SMITH ON IRRIGATION

Addison T. Smith, representative in congress from the Second Idaho district, has disapproved the bills of the farmers living on reclamation projects and suggested remedies which, if applied, are certain to prove beneficial even if they do not effect a complete cure. Representative Smith is chairman of the irrigation of arid lands committee of the house and undoubtedly possesses as much information on the subject as any other man, in or out of congress. The weight of authority must therefore attach to his words. In the course of an interview given in the closing hours of the sixty-seventh congress, Mr. Smith declares that while much has been done for the farmer in the shape of legislation, with a fair prospect of more aid in the future, it is up to the settlers on reclamation projects to help themselves.

Mr. Smith concedes that the irrigation farmer cannot prosper under the load of fixed charges against his crops which he is carrying at the present time. But he calls attention to the fact that the getting into debt habit has considerable to do with the unfortunate fix in which the agriculturalist now finds himself, and he comments upon this phase of the situation as follows:

"How he managed to get into debt is interesting and instructive. Taking, for example, a typical case. The land which has no value without water was given him by the government. The water supply was furnished by the use of government funds without interest, or less than cost. He was to return this investment in ten annual installments without interest. Subsequently, this was changed to twenty, also without interest, or, as expressed on the floor of the house, it was not possible for any man to ask for more terms than to be told he could borrow, or have the use of, from \$2000 to \$4000 if he would pay 5 per cent interest for twenty years and then have the principal given to him. In the eyes of the men who framed this legislation, nothing had been or could be offered to the farmer on more liberal terms, and the granting of the twenty-year term of repayment was regarded as the very limit beyond which no reasonable man could ask for."

"These conditions of credit obtained on condition of settlement and cultivation of the land at cost and without interest charges, favor the possessor of the land in a certain amount of credit. In other words, if he should fail to build a farm he could borrow up to and even beyond the investment made by the government in the land, because it was believed that the land with water and with a farmer on it had a value far beyond the investment made by the government. Millions of dollars in the aggregate were thus borrowed by handovers. Estimates presented showed that, taking all of the 30,000 farms irrigated by the government, there is a gross indebtedness to bankers, loan companies, implement dealers and local merchants of from fifty million to eighty million dollars, paying interest on an average of not less than 5 per cent, or an interest bill of four million to eight million dollars. In the aggregate, each year under the reclamation projects the landowners are paying or are urged to pay by local creditors the amount which approaches the total amount that all of them have ever paid back to the government on the installments for water during the whole twenty years. This illustrates the relative weight of the burden of debts to the private as contrasted with the public creditor."

Some of the settlers on reclamation projects received more land than they could utilize, and the result has been disastrous, and they are being forced along the bankruptcy road by the payment of interest, taxes and other charges against their property as a whole. The Idaho representative urges these men to dispose of a portion of their holdings and farm the remaining acres intensively. The advice in this particular is sound and should be followed. Congress has shown a willingness to aid the agriculturalist in many ways, but unless the farmers adopt a different course from that which many of them are now pursuing they will never get out of the hole.

As Representative Smith justly observes, there are good, bad and indifferent farmers. The first named, in most cases, are able to meet their obligations and make a living by cultivating irrigated lands. The others would not succeed in any country under exceptionally good conditions without changing their methods. It is to be hoped they will profit by the advice of Chairman Smith, who has rendered a valuable public service by giving out the interview from which we have quoted.—The Tribune.
