In a signed statement of a Mr. Bender, organizer for the Ku Klux Klan in Twin Falls, it is claimed that none of the candidates on the Lambing ticket are klansmen, neither are any of their original campaign committee. So far the statement is correct probably, but by half-truths they have again evaded the With the A dame.

In the first place they fail to prove or attempt to prove that the Klan is NOT back of the Lambing Ticket. In fact, their silence on the matter condemns them. They cannot deny that the only known Klan representatives are frantically working for the Lambing Ticket.

It is the desire of the Hodgin supporters to come out in the open on all matters in this campaign and in articles printed in The Times and News, statement is made that TWO of the Lambing Ticket have ADMITTED MAKING APPLICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE KLAN in the presence of witnesses. While not actually members in a literal sense yet their connection is merely a matter of detail.

It is interesting to note that Mr. Bender's affidavit fails to state that these men are not members of the Twin Falls temporary Klan organization.

In the same article denial is made that the members of the Lambing campaign committee are Klansmen. This, too, may be literally true. THE CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE IS NOT ON TRIAL before the public. But there is a possibility that the statement of that article is too, an evasion. Probably there is no chartered Klan in Twin Falls nor bona fide members of that organization. Yet statements used to get new members lay claim to a large number of members. Puzzle—When is a member not a member, and when is a Klan not a Klan?

Let the people of this city irrespective of their affiliations decide whether it is for the best interests of the whole city to elect a ticket composed of a square out in the open group of men unaffected by any insidious influence, or on the other hand, elect a ticket which has the solid backing of an organization operating n secret and ashamed to show the faith that is within them.
