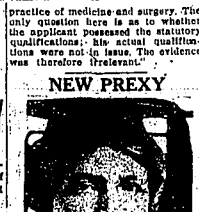
Potentialities of Leadership

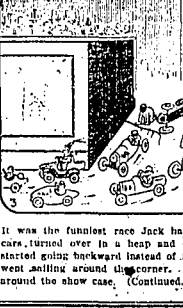

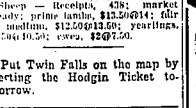
