SAVE TAXES AND BRADSHATE NODDIN WEEDS

The Board of Commissioners of Twin Falls County, Oregon, solicits the active cooperation of every rancher and land-owner in the County in eradicating the Canadian Thistle and other noxious weeds.

It is desired that the campaign of eradication be carried on systematically to the County, as well as to the farmer. To save expenses and taxes the office of Weed Inspector and his assistants have been temporarily discontinued but the office of County Agent is at the disposal of the public in determining the best means to stamp out noxious weeds. Farmers may be free to call upon Mr. Broadshate at any time for advice and suggestions. Bulletin or information will be furnished on request.

The Commissioners are empowered by law to enforce the statute, taxing a penalty against those who permit the growth of noxious weeds on their premises. They will be glad to receive any information concerning those who are in default in the matter. One of the most effective methods

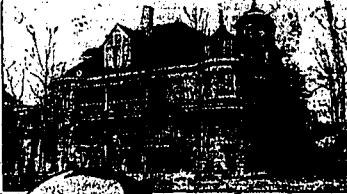
