

SUCCESSOR TO BROWN LAW'S NEW PROBLEM

LONDON, May 21.—Great Britain sought a leader today.

Political opinion was about equally divided between Marquis Curzon, foreign secretary and Stanley Baldwin, chancellor of the exchequer, as the man to succeed Mr. Lloyd George.

The latter in whose hands appointment of Bonar Law's successor for the moment, hurried to London from meetings in all parts of the British Isles.

Meanwhile Mr. Curzon is believed to be the favorite for the premiership.

The Daily Chronicle, London's conservative organ, says that the Welsh ex-premier's little parliamentary group longer will support a premier as Mr. Lloyd George.

Mr. Curzon, most likely choice, cannot claim such support.

Mr. Baldwin should decline to act as chancellor of the exchequer.

Mr. Curzon is believed to have a labor government.

WILL HEALTH NOT CAUSE OF DRUGS

LOS ANGELES, May 21.—Dr. G. Goodrich, chief physician at the receiving hospital, where 25,000 patients are treated yearly, does not believe that the majority of drug addicts start the habit because of ill health, contrary to the popular belief.

"I believe that fully 90 per cent of the addicts treated and examined here start the use of drugs for the same reason: the urge of tobacco and whiskey start those habits," Goodrich said.

"All habits, whiskey, tobacco and vice disposition are allied and degrees of vice are graduated. If a man has not enough moral fibre to get from tobacco to whiskey and the bottom of the bottle he does."

"Understand," Goodrich said, "I'm not a reformer. My reason for speaking on the subject is that I am interested in the way in which the drug steps in when the vitality is so weakened that the ordinary stimulants, tobacco and whiskey fall to revive flagging energies. Persons with criminal tendencies are generally preyed upon by the traffickers in narcotics. They would not take under normal conditions."

"About a dozen times will meet anyone on the way to addiction. The physical craving for drugs, can be frustrated, but a person who has been an addict for any length of time never forgets dope. He might overcome the habit permanently but generally his craving power and fighting spirit are too weak. The chances are three to one that he will go back if given the opportunity."

Oldest Channel Island Resident Dies, Aged 74

AVAILON, CATALINA ISLAND, May 21.—Salvador Ramirez, oldest pioneer of the Channel Islands, was found dead recently in his little camp at Saugerties Cove, San Clemente Island, by a party of fishermen from the mainland.

Ramirez, who was 74 when he died, spent most of his life as a hermit on one of the small cluster of islands off the southern California coast. It was one of his uncles who told Catalina Island to a Santa Barbara attorney for a horse and a saddle.

Many years ago when Catalina was becoming too populous for the refuge, he moved to San Clemente Island in his little sailing boat but took three goats to start a goat ranch.

There has now more than 6,000 goats on San Clemente, all direct descendants of the three little animals that he took away from Catalina Island.

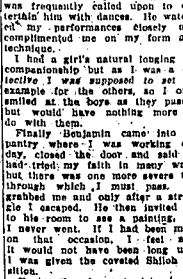

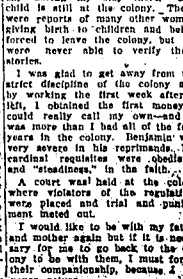

When I left America I carried with me the impression that Greece had taken the licking of her life from Turkey; that she had had all her manly manhood taken from her; that even as a Balkan power she was "talk" for a long time to come.

Thank to my Greek here and he almost weeps, so deeply does he feel the humiliation of the Asia Minor disaster.

Never for a single moment does the Greek admit defeat.

He was let down by a band of politicians back in Greece, who contend who was money Greece had in hand to bolster up the late King Constantine for purely selfish ends.

They sent our army barging out into the interior of Asia Minor; they forgot all about it—forgot to feed the army, forgot to pay the army, forgot to let it march.

The Greek army today is ready to go.

That will mean a population of about 2000 people in the next few years. Have you thought of what that means to Twin Falls? It will be a market for produce raised on the farms here. But that is not all. This will be the wholesale market for the district. There will be no competition from Salt Lake City but a great part of the wholesale trade can be handled in this city.

It will allow you some telegrams which have been received from Riverside in a short time. I do this for the purpose of indicating that just as soon as the construction begins on the road there will be development of the mines and men will begin going to Riverside to mine some high grade ore in the district.
