## HUSBAND HELD IN JAIL PENDING LEGAL ACTION

The medicine was forced through the mails after husband, from whom she was separated, admits that he sent her medicine through the mails, but says that it was only calomel. He has been in jail ever since the poisoning was reported to the officers, charged with contributing to an action. He denied positively that he forced calomel on her and declines to disclose the person from whom he received the alleged calomel.

Old Resident of Twin Falls Dies in Yakima, Wash.

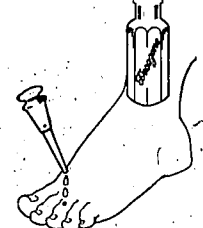

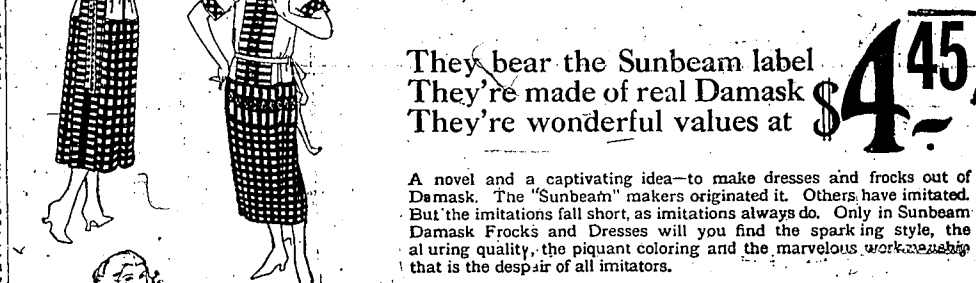

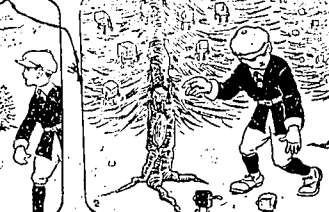
