



AARON SAPIRO WONDERFUL CHARACTER

The April American contained an exhaustive writenp of Auron Sapiro, leader of great cooperative marketing movements among farmers, who with Walton Petcet, is expected Friday under the auspices of the Idaho Producers' Union. Under a large cut, the American says:

"Mr. Sapiro is the recognized leader of the co-operative mar-keting movement among farmers. He has organized, and is counasel for, scores of co-operative associations, with a total membership of more than a half million persons. Mv. Sapiro's life is an epic atruggle against hardships and handicaps. Born in San Francisco 38 years ago, he lived in the bitter poverty until he was 10 years old—when he was committed to an orphan asylum, whose archite routine might well have crashed all ambition and individuality within him. But the youth struggled shead and led his classes in grammar school and high school. Following his release from the orphan asylum, he worked his way through college and law school-again leading his classes. While holding public office in California his sympathies were aroused at the injustices which crop growers had to combat—so be decided to dedicate himself to removing some of these injustices."

It is also shown that later in life, Mr. Sapire reorganized the orphan asylum in which he spent six years of his life.

REHABILITATION OF SILVER

The world has never as yet accepted paper money except when sopported by an adequate metallic reserve. At this time, one of the chief obstycles to a return to normal conditions in central Europe is the fact that no metallic money is available and that business is attempting to function with paper money.

When silver takes its place as a world money metal the mining


