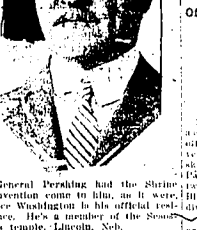

## UTAH BANK MUST STAND LOSS OF FORGED CHECK

**Supreme Court in Suit Brought by John T. Reid vs. Down International Bank Regarding Bounced \$1000.00 Drawer of Cashier's Check by Impersonator of Friend.**

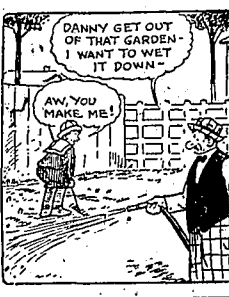

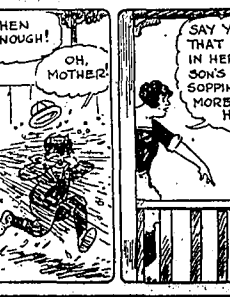
