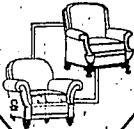

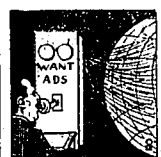

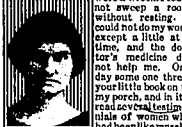

BORAH WILL BE NOMINATED

(By JAMES D. WIELAN.) The declaration of Senator Borah that he will remain in the republican party, that President Harding will be unanimously nominated and that the world court project will be defeated in the senate and out of the way by the time of the election 1924, contains nothing surprising. Borah left the republicans party in 1896 on the free silver issue, as a free silver republican. He came back four years later when we were "becoming a world power and abandoning the obsolete doctrine of isolationism." Through thick and thin he has been regular ever since; not regular enough to hurt in 1912, when his attitude was somewhat similar to the one he occupied during the last state campaign, but still regular and not a better. Borah will be nominated for senator as he admits that he wants to be. Having made his peace with Harding, the effort to defeat him in the convention will devolve to nothing. There may be a small bolt, but since there will be surface harmony between Borah and Moore it will not be permitted to cut much ice, but it hurt Moore's chances and take the state away from Harding. Many who voted for Samuels will line up for him in the republican primaries, so that his equivocal attitude last fall is expected to benefit the republican party. Borah has powerful backers in Idaho. Ed Dewey, the real power behind the Capital News is for him. Dewey is a very large stockholder in the power company. Borah's legal connections with the lumber interests have made him influential friends there. His relations with Senator Hart of the Utah-Idaho Sugar company have always been a political asset which is about to prevent an uprising within the ranks of the G. O. P. He has more influence with the Union Pacific railroad system than the junior senator from Idaho has.

Considering all these things, it is easy to predict what will happen at the next republican convention. Borah will be nominated. He will be elected, too, unless falls should inspire too closely into the inconsistency of a man having so many friends in so many antagonistic elements.

From the point of view of party expediency, demagogues may well hope that Borah's prediction that the world court plan will be killed by republican senators. It has the backing of great forces. All League of Nations advocates will be for it as a step toward world harmony. Senator Shields of Tennessee, a democratic irreconcilable is for it. Secretary Charles S. McFarland of the Federal Council of Churches is for it. Many religious bodies are for it. If the republican senators beat this measure, the republican party will have hard sledding next time. Should Harding fail to carry it through, a leader will be found to do so.

MEN THINK IN TERMS OF HOGS; WOMEN IN TERMS OF BABIES

Of the following, Mrs. Thomas G. Winter says, "This delightful letter which was sent to every member of the Iowa legislature, deserves printing in full."

My dear sir: Valley Junction, Iowa. I saw by the papers that the bill appropriating \$21,000 for the care of mothers and infants, under the Sheppard-Towner bill, had been killed. Then I saw that a bill had been introduced appropriating \$500,000 for the treating of hogs. With this last bill I am in hearty sympathy and I hope it will pass. I grew up on an Iowa farm and I know what hogs mean to Iowa. I believe that we cannot spend too much money to improve and care for our hogs. The prosperity of the state and its leadership among other states depends on the kind of hogs we raise, and I hope you will vote for this appropriation.

I cannot help feeling, however, that it was a mistake not to appropriate the money for the welfare of mothers and babies. Not that I usually believe in Iowa accepting federal money. I think if we keep up our standards of raising corn and hogs we can appropriate all the money we need for ourselves. But I understand that the state university has already done considerable work under the Sheppard-Towner law and that many women in backward sections of the state have taken advantage of the clinics and the services of the doctors to have themselves and their children examined and that already a good many babies have been cured of defects and the mothers have been told how to prevent these defects and sickness in future children. I think education like this should be encouraged because we improve our breed of hogs are going to need a better class of men and women to take care of them.

When I was a girl any kind of a hired man could throw corn and fodder to the hogs and any kind of a hired girl could carry dishwater and kitchen slaps to the pigs. But this kind of labor cannot properly care for hogs now. With our new breeds and with the new diseases that continually threaten them we must have more intelligent and better educated people to take care of them. In order to do this we must provide better babies. We ought not to try to save money at the expense of the hogs. So I hope you will try in some way to reconsider this bill for the cure of babies. Then everybody would understand just what the bill means and I do not believe there would be so much objection to it. I hope you will use your influence to do this. We ought to
