SCAB WORKER IS SLAIN BY HIRED THUGS

Union Man Admits Hiring Men to Kill Non-Union Workmen; Was Beaten to Death; Presence is Odious to Business Agent.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., July 3—Frank C. Reche, business agent for the Vi-tars Workers' union, admitted today he hired four men to go to St. Louis, Mo., to kill Joseph A. Rose, non-union electrical worker, according to police.

Reche, together with Raymond Shultz, and William J. Matthews, union members, were charged with first degree murder. Two others, accused of conspiracy in the killing, were not identified.

In his alleged confession, Reche told how he hired the union workers to drive the scabs off the job.

JACK WINS BY DECISION IN 15th

RINGSIDE, SHELBUR, MONT., July 4.—Jack Dempsey retained the heavyweight championship of the world when he won a 15 round decision from Tommy Gibbons here this afternoon. After the fight had ended and amid scenes of the wild, referee James Daugherty of Philadelphia, held up the champions hand at the winner and then tucked out of the arena.

The fight was witnessed by a crowd of 20,000 fans, half of whom came the last minute when the promoters decided to let them in at \$5 a head. The decision was accepted by most of the experts as fair and just. The general opinion, that Gibbons had done well.
