## STUDY RAIL PROBLEM IN NORTHLAND

**President Believes Road Should Be Operated with Utmost Economy at Present; May Be Required to Decide Location for Terminal.**

**FAIRBANKS**, Alaska, July 17.—The study of the Alaskan railroad over its entire length and observed closely the possibilities of growth and development, President Harding committed to the railroad the task of finding the most economical possible fashion until a broader program is warranted.

He believes the present and the immediate future promise nothing in the way of a great increase in tonnage, stretching, at country through which the line runs fromeward to Fairbanks.

## JOHNSON CHOSEN SUCCESSOR TO LATE SENATOR NELSON

**Dirt Farmer Candidate Conceded Victory Over Harding's Choice, Governor Preus; Plurality Will Be Around 60,000; Returns to Farm to Help Out with the Haying.**

**ST. PAUL**, July 17.—Plurality of 50,000 for Johnson, dirt farmer, candidate for senator, was returned to the ballot box, according to results of the election, today.

The farmer-labor victory margin passed the 60,000 mark and a final count of 100,000 for the late Senator J. A. Preus was predicted.

**MT. PAUL**, Minn., July 17.—President Harding's replacement administration fell before the voters yesterday, and the new legislature will be elected.

**WASHINGTON**, July 17.—President Harding's replacement, a member of the labor party candidate, to the U.S. Senate, was conceded yesterday, according to the election returns.

The Johnson victory definitely takes the Minnesota congressional group out of D. O. P. "old guard" ranks and aligns it with the Labor-Farm-Brookings bloc.

It will be 50,000.

Johnson will fill out the unexpired term of the late Senator Nelson who died April 28, 1922, and was succeeded by Senator Preus for reelection in 1924.

The champion's manager admitted he couldn't get a great purse outside of New York but he said they would work for what they could get.

After a conference with Rickard yesterday, Kearns said: "Dempsey worked in New York against Willis and the champion was downed twice. I think the champion will contend that a champion worth that much, and he pointed out that a boxer from Jersey City got the top price to 125, without being the champion as much as he got for fighting Carpenter, even if he took half of the gate."

Tom O'Brien, Jimmy Johnson and Rickard are all bidding for the champion's services, but as Kearns put it: "One has shown us about a dozen."
