Contempt Citation to Salmon Directors

In the citation for contempt of court issued yesterday by Judge W. A. Hildner returnable August 1, at 2 o'clock before Judge O. R. Baum, wherein the directors of the Salmon River Canal company and their attorney, Judge James H. Hottel, are called on to explain why they should not be punished for their alleged determination to issue water under the sluiceway water plant, after injunction order of Judge T. Hally Lee. Judge Lee, who is now on vacation, issued the injunction in the case of its claimant, against the Salmon Canal company.

The company takes the position that having appealed from the decision of Judge Lee and having filed a bond to cover losses in the event that the Supreme court should rule otherwise, the injunction is dissolved. The plaintiffs in whose behalf the order was issued, take the position that while this rule might apply in the future the writ was in the nature of a permanent injunction, limited thereto in the nature of a prohibition.

A RAT'S TALE

You read "Pigs Is Pigs," of course, and laughed. Here's a true case, something along the same line. The late Lord Moulton was a high executive of the British government during the war. His son publishes a book about the old man's career, and says that after he retired from public life he used to amuse himself by "re-reading some of the more glaring instances of the amount of work which would be devoted to the most trivial matters."

Lord Moulton, it is said, had a habit of having used the British official documents known as the Great Rat correspondence.

The total of these documents looks like a report by one of our congressional investigation committees. A few of them give you the general idea. First sample:

With reference to R. M. Q. M. O. T. 11987, twenty special rats were obtained for the Chemical Shell store, and authority is now requested please for an expenditure of a price per week per rat for maintenance, as besides being kept alive they must always be in good condition to satisfactorily serve the purpose for which they were provided.

After passing through various hands and accumulating a raft of departmental comments, this official answer was received:

No objection to necessary expenditure within it please a week a rat. We have no information as to cost, but should have thought it might be less. You no doubt will take steps to see that the establishment is not unduly increased.

As months slipped by and the great war raged, correspondence concerning the rats led to an increasingly more complicated one.

Next, 12 rats were originally purchased, but the stock shortly increased to 20. Three of these were sent to the French Warfare Filling factory and 3 destroyed, leaving a total of 25. In view of the Chemical Shell store at Gatwick, shortly opening, it would be highly to destroy these rats, as at least a dozen will be required for Gatwick. It is therefore considered necessary to keep a stock of 30 rats at Woodfield and Gatwick, i. e., 18 Woodfield (including reserve of 6) and 12 at Gatwick. Any surplus above this number will be sold, if possible, and profit credited to the Rat fund, or else destroyed. Authority is requested for the above establishment to be maintained.

It cost England thousands of dollars to keep track of these rats. The correspondence is typical of the procrastination and stupidity of our own Red Tape Worms in Washington. Since most governmental matters are handled in the same spirit in most countries, governmental delay and head-boneness are proverbial.

Roseworth Caravan Settles Sue for Return of Money

Want P. C. Meredith and E. T. Meredith to Return Money and Damages for Alleged Misrepresentation in Sale of Lands.

Suits based on alleged fraudulent representations made to have been made by E. T. Meredith and P. C. Meredith were filed here last evening in behalf of Alfred E. Hyde for \$4,270.10 payment and damages; G. Hant, for \$3,651.94 payment and damages; and Frederick H. Baily for \$4,270.10 payment and damages, said to be due in regard to their purchase of Roseworth lands bought when the Steel Caravan came through. 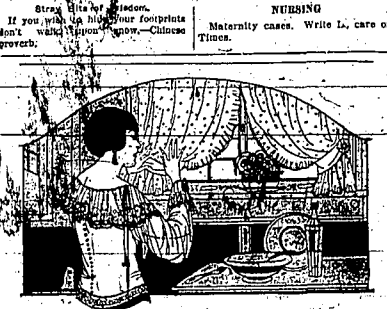

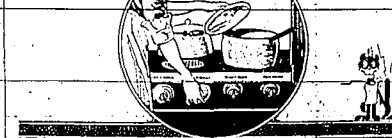
