The criminal mind, however, seems to have a peculiar warp that makes the perting of wealth by crooked means seem the existent way. On the law of averages, it is easier, to get rich honestly_than dishonestly.

You can picture Gonzales, sitting around for months or even years, rolling shuck eighrets and running his resourceful brain high-

priced until he figured out his scheme.

It is almost astounding, the extent to which the human brain will resort to get something for nothing. In other words, to "get

by" without honest, useful endeavor.

It is true of swindlers. And it is true of most of us, especially the swindlers' victims. Wasting so much time, trying to get something for nothing, is what keeps' many people poor. There's not enough time left for really productive effort.




