# DELANO MINE PREPARES ON BIG SCALE

Officers of Nevada-Bellevue Copper Company Plan Extensive Construction Work for Contact, Pleased at Re-survey as Indication That Road Intends to Prepare for Heavy Traffic with Little Delay; Utah Construction Gets Supplies.

That the successful working out of the plan for teaching and concentrating now being tested, would enable the Nevada-Bellevue Copper company, owners of the famous DeLano mine to erect a mill and ship ore on a large scale even before it would be possible for the Oregon Short Line to put in the road, which the officers expect to be built within the time promised by the company, was the opinion expressed here today by Secretary D. G. Eganman and General Manager W. H. Rose, who with R. K. Easter, heavy stockholder, returned from a visit to Contact.

With reference to The Times re-survey story, Mr. Eganman, who is a prominent Seattle attorney, said that the brief delay would mean that the road for the DeLano mine was being built, and that the Union Pacific was taking care to get a location where a road handling heavy traffic could be constructed.

The DeLano mine, in which Mr. Eganman was buying his first visit, has long been a prime property. High grade ore in the value of more than \$50,000 has been shipped out and the profit has to a great extent paid for the extensive development work on the property. The new process would enable the company to attract "metal" from lower grade ore and ship with profit. The road could be finished, Mr. Easter is a large capitalist from Seattle. Vice President H. M. Casey of the Nevada-Bellevue company is "on the way here" and on his next visit will be made to the mine.

# SCHOOL BOARD MAKES ANNUAL LEVY OF TAXES

Twenty-two Mills Held Necessary to Defray Expenses for the Coming Year; Budget Officers Lament That of Last Year as Levied.

A levy of 22 mills this year was again an "annual" valuation of approximately eight million dollars, was made by the school board last night at a meeting held in the auditorium at 10:30 o'clock. The budget for the coming year is \$1,150,000 at the time the levy was made a year ago. The amount of the budget last year was \$2,221,074 during the year. The budget last year called for the raising of \$167,276 by taxes, while the budget this year calls for the raising of \$178,000 by that means. Last year's amount was made for the raising of \$45,500 from miscellaneous sources and this year allowance is made for the raising of the even sum of \$64,000 by this means.

# Late Emerson Hough Called Apostle of the Southwest

By Doris Blair. Lived life he described among pioneers, hardships and dangers of Early West.

The late Emerson Hough might well be called "The Apostle of the Southwest," for to him more than to any other man, it is due the fact that we have a picture of the life of our development. Too often have we the "early West and Southwest" been glorified in the hands of authors without real knowledge of the people of the time. This has grown up a lurid literature, filled and unreal, though some more fabulous heres and villains blacker than the night. But Hough lived amid the conditions he described. At the age of twenty-three he was practicing law in the building, little cow town of White Oaks, New Mexico. He knew the pioneers, the desperadoes and bad men of the early Southwest. In his new book, "North of 36," he has given us a magnificent and stirring picture of the great cattle drive from Texas north to Abilene, Kansas. The herd belongs to a beautiful young girl, "Talis Luckhimer." An orphan, as her rough cow hands call her. She is brave—cannot pay her men—and a market for the small herd left her by the pillaging desperadoes of the country. And by the way, this Luckhimer is as picturesque a character of the frontier as any found in the pages of Bret Harte. Although fame must rest largely upon this tract, most complete and stirring account of the opening of the great Southwest.
