Automobile Thief Gains Ground Annually Against Nation's Police



FIGURES recently compiled from police records of twenty-four representative American cities, and now in the files of the Auto Life Insurance Company, reveal the automobile thief as a national menace annually more sinister.

In 1918 the cities included in this study reported 24,843 automobiles stolen. The number rose to 29,081 in 1919, after falling somewhat in 1920. It reached a high level of 40,756 in 1921. The total thefts reported in 1922 was 31,628.

During this period there was a gradually increasing percentage of stolen cars that were never recovered.

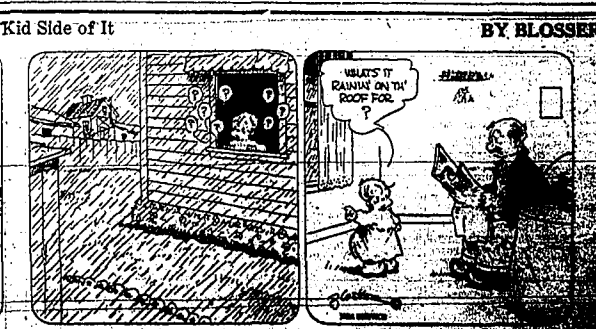
