

COOLIDGE TO USE CAUTION IN MESSAGE

No Hurred Legislation Favored by Executive; Time Will Be Taken to Thoroughly Understand Governmental Problems.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14.—President Coolidge will limit his first message to Congress to absolute essentials.

In conference with party leaders who will begin returning to Washington next week, Mr. Coolidge will determine exactly what, in his judgment, it will be possible to accomplish in a session which must end early next June at the latest.

The president and chief advisers, while they have not yet formulated the details of the administration's legislative program, have restricted on certain guiding principles. These include:

—Exclusion of everything likely to bring about a "jam" or cause defeat of the administration; —Exclusion of all recommendations which are not of the nature of a necessary reform, or only such new legislation which is probably generally considered beforehand and which is obviously necessary.

—Exclusion of most of the great controversial legislative questions for later consideration and action.

Reasons for the careful limitation thus proposed are several. First, Mr. Coolidge intends in his recommendations to attempt to stick to his slogan of "stability" and will neither recommend nor favor action on a short session, crowded with a tremendous routine program of questions that ought to receive long and careful consideration.

Second, the administration is not yet sure of its strength in the new Congress, where the western progressive bloc, holding the balance of power, will have to deal with carefully.

Third, with a presidential campaign coming in which Mr. Coolidge is the chief, he has decided to have his message, in his own words, a strategy to leave doubt of any party politics, and to let Mr. Coolidge go to the country with them and in support from their own interests, rather than to try them out on a Congress first and perhaps have some of them rejected.

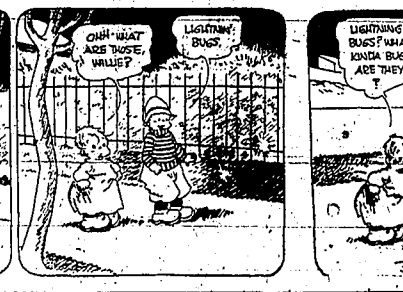
