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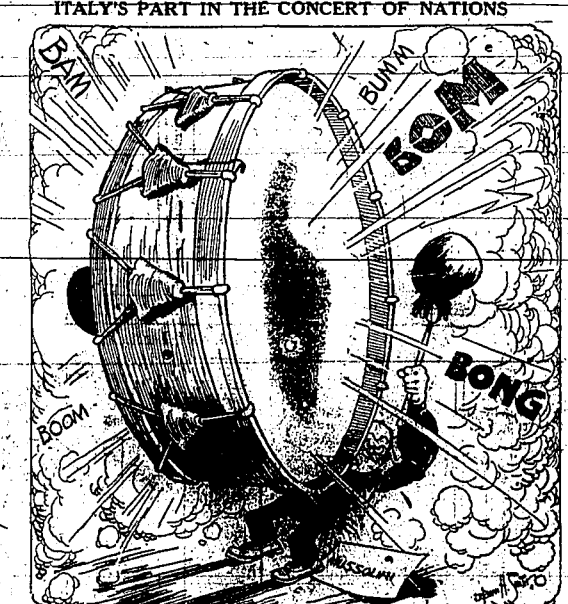

He should drop in here on a Saturday afternoon or evening if he thinks our regular business shows up well.

The Twin Falls post of the American Legion is making extensive preparations for a big day next week and we feel that they should have the hearty support of every citizen in the Magic City. The world war veterans are a great bunch of boosters and are doing much good work from time to time towards keeping Twin Falls on the map, so let's co-operate with them.

Jerome and Burley are holding their county fairs this week and we understand that both places have some very fine exhibits and good programs throughout. Burley has the flyers and Jerome has a good race track. We hope that as many of our people as can find time to get away will see each of these fairs and that we may all work together for a bigger and better Southern Idaho Annual exhibit of this kind are essential to the growth and development of every community and we congratulate each of these communities on their progressive spirit.

Contact is getting ready for the Rogerson-Wells railroad which will be started this fall or early next year. They are now putting up many new buildings and blocking out the rich ore in their mines preparatory to shipment on the first train which pulls in their over the new line next summer. Contact will become a wonderful city when this new road is completed and this city to the south will be a great boost to business in Twin Falls and all of Southern Idaho. We believe that the Oregon Short Line railroad will not lose sight of the fact that the people of Twin Falls have made good on their end of the contract and raised the \$25,000 asked by that railroad company and we have a right to expect prompt compliance on the part of the railroad company in the expediting of this branch line. Both parties must make good on every contract and we feel sure that the Oregon Short Line will not allow the people here to get a wrong impression of their motives and intentions.

KICKING THE SUPREME COURT

The attacks upon the supreme court of the United States which followed the determination that the child labor law was unconstitutional have been, if one follows the reasoning of Chief Justice Taft, no more than are occasionally to be expected. America's supreme court, it appears, is never so much in danger as when it declares popular legislation unconstitutional and seems to stand in the way of the will of the majority of the people.

Yet the court cannot permit itself on this account to be at all concerned with popular sentiment. It has, to guide by feel, the constitution, which says how far the branches of government shall be permitted to go. This is the last word direct from the sovereign people, and if the acting representatives of those people in congress do something wholly without their powers in the courts, it is their duty to have been to that constitution, not the court, which says their action is ineffective. All the people may want the thing done, but the court has no choice, it must stick by the constitution. Here are the words of the chief justice on the subject of attacking the court:

From time to time, by reason of its jurisdiction, and its proper exercise, the court cannot help becoming the stormy petrel of politics. It is the head of the system of federal courts established avowedly to avoid the local prejudice which non-residents may encounter in state courts, a function often likely to ruffle the susceptibilities of the communities, the possibility of whose prejudice is thus recognized and avoided. More than this, the court's duty to ignore the acts of congress or of the state legislatures, if out of line with the fundamental law of the nation, inevitably throws it as an obstruction across the path of the true majority who have enacted the invalid legislation. The stronger the majority, and the more intense its partisan feeling, the less likely is it to regard constitutional limitations upon its powers and the more likely is it to enact laws of questionable validity.

It is convincing evidence of the sound sense of the American people in the long run and their love of civil liberty and its constitutional guarantees, that, in spite of hostility thus frequently engendered, the court has lived with its powers unimpaired, until the present day.

The supreme court is the only check in our government against hysterical and strictly empirical public sentiment. It saves our form of government when the whole people seem, under the stress of temporary situation, to be beside themselves. Congress can be influenced and presidents forced by public opinion, but the court must not. And yet the court does not really frustrate the people. In any case, it merely determines that they are trying to do something that has not been held to approve on their behalf and lets them know they have to change the fundamental law, if their ardor keeps up, in order to get their way.—Statesman.

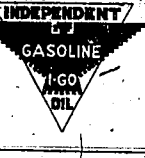

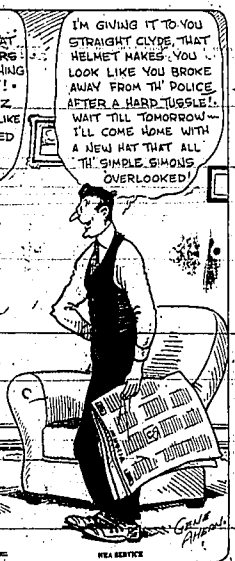

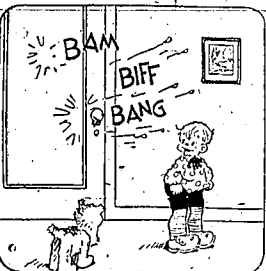

# BOY SCOUTS

## MOTHERS AID SCOUT SONS

"Mothers," whose commendation counts for the most and whose approval is hardest to win in matters pertaining to the welfare of her boy, are more and more showing their "heart and soul" with knowledge, as attested by the growing number of scout mothers' clubs and auxiliaries.

"Faith, love and protection of our boys?" is the motto of the "Poppy (Kath) Scout Mothers' Club," its purpose, "to assist the scoutmaster in any possible way in advancing the cause and to learn by our association together, more of our responsibilities as mothers of scouts."

In Portsmouth, Va., members of the Scout Mothers' Club wear bows of ribbon in accordance with the rating of their boys. This club aims to keep the training of the scout mother and law before the community, to maintain a feeling of comradeship between mother and son, to cooperate with the scout leaders in their work, and to put before new residents the advantage of having their boys join the scout movement.

## A BOY SCOUT HERO

The great moment in a scout's life when his preparedness can be the means of saving a human life, came to First-Class Scout Cecil Smith, Hatch of Troop 11, Texarkana, Texas, under circumstances requiring resourcefulness and courage to a high degree. Hatch, who is suffering with tuberculosis of the lungs, the other day was walking slowly towards home after school when he was attracted by a sudden scream from a tree nearby, and saw there a small boy caught high up in the branches and hanging to an electric wire. The rapping noise continued to the top of the tree within a few inches of the menacing current. On account of the heavy voltage he did not touch the electric body with his hands until after he had freed him from the wire. "This little fellow," said the boy, "was hanging there jerking like from the wire. The scout caught the little fellow in one arm, then lowered him down from the tree and carried him to his home. There he administered first-aid treatment pending the arrival of the doctor."

## Federal Licensed Plan Over for the Present Year

System Extending Warehouses Here in Good Condition State National House at Portville Falls by Winter Expiration.

There will be no federal licensed warehouses in this part of the country this year, according to information received here from the bureau of agricultural economics by the chamber of commerce. The formal governmental enterprise, in being extended and a survey of the Twin Falls tract that year which says extends later in the extension of the system here.

This plan has nothing to do with the farm loan system. In a letter it is said: "It is not within the province of the bureau charged with the administration of the U. S. warehouses act to establish warehouses. Our function is to co-operate with the warehouse firm already in existence who are able to qualify for license under the federal government, to issue and that warehouse receipts issued by them may be of unguaranteed facility. It is intended that the warehouse receipts mentioned above may have such strength that they will be readily negotiable in the banking world."

Of course, the federal licensing system is not necessary in order to make the paper issued by reliable warehouses negotiable in banks where they are shown. This city is fortunate in the reliable character of its warehouses proprietors, it is declared.

The proposed state district warehouse at Portville has died. The constitutionality of the measure which permitted it was considered doubtful by lawyers; it was felt on one hand that it would certainly go to Portville, and there was a stipulation that it would not go to this view. On the other hand, three most shipments now go to the state district, since this will be much more time after the construction of the new line from Tropicson to Wells, a district warehouse at Portville would mean a haul from Twin Falls and Bull to the eastern side of the state and another haul back again. In only one or two of the 24 counties was it considered with any favor and it died, through the limitation of the statute, which expired some weeks ago.

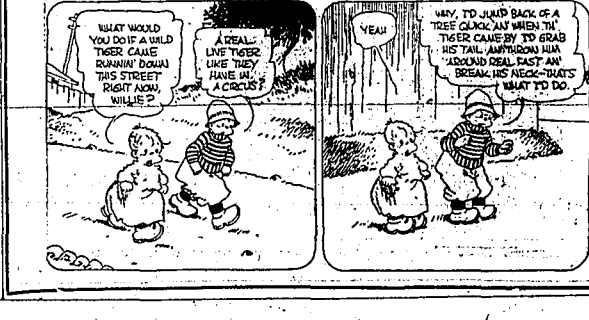

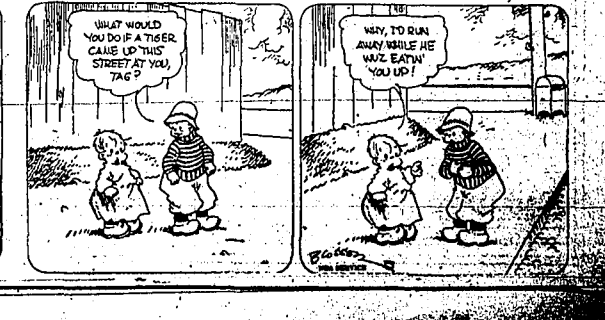
