WORLD SERIES OPENS OCTOBER 10 IN STADIUM

Yankees Will Play Winners of National League First Game of World Series on October 10th in Yankee Stadium. If Giants Win, Second Game Will Go to Polo Grounds.

NEW YORK, Sept. 25.—The first game of the 1923 world series between the New York Yankees and the winner of the National league pennant will be played in New York on Wednesday, October 10.

Conduct of the series were announced here this afternoon by Kenesaw M. Landis, commissioner of baseball, after a conference with officials of the National and American leagues.

The series will open at the new Yankee stadium and if the Giants should win the National league pennant the second game will be played at the Polo Grounds.

The Yankees will be regarded as the home team in games Nos. 1, 3 and 5. The Giants will be the home team in games 2, 4 and 6.

The Cincinnati Reds should win the pennant, the first two games will be played in New York and the next two games will be played in Cincinnati.

It will be decided later when the remaining games of the New York-Cincinnati series would be played, if they are necessary.

Prices of admission will remain the same as last year if the series is played in New York.

Box seats will cost \$6; reserved seats, \$5; unreserved seats of the upper and lower stands \$3 and bleacher seats \$1.

All the games will start at 7 o'clock, the time prevailing in the city in which the games are played.

If Cincinnati wins the National league pennant the prices for admission in Cincinnati will be decided later.

The business of the country has given evidence of growth stability during the Summer months, and enters the Fall season with general confidence prevailing.

The fact that forward buying has been light, coupled with the fact that retail trade over the country has been good, gives assurance that stocks of merchandise must be constantly replenished.

On the whole the outlook for the business year is bright. The supply requirements of a well-provided population, with little speculative activity and with few price changes, this signifies that after the great upheaval caused by the war the country is heading back to more stable conditions.

Medio Recognized The restoration of diplomatic relations between the governments of the United States and Mexico is an event which may prove to be of important significance in a business way.

The matters that have been at issue between the two countries have been under patient consideration between the Mexican government and a very competent commission appointed by the President of the United States.

Medio is a country of very great natural resources, which can be developed only by the investment of American capital.

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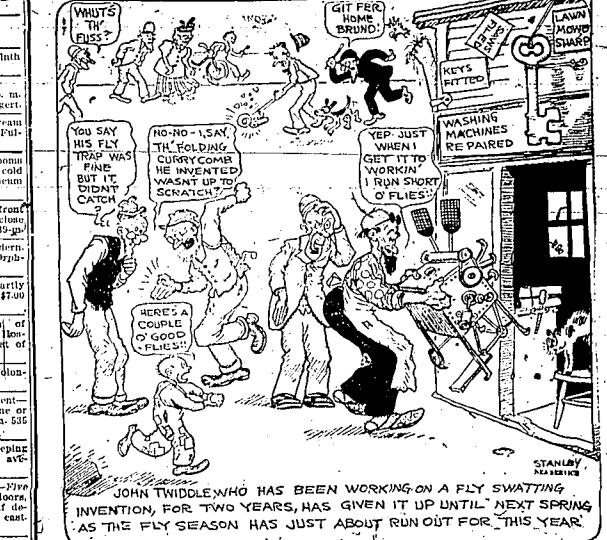
