OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Oct. 2.—Oklahoma held its state-wide election today and called for its ballot. Polling places opened generally throughout the state at 7 a. m. today for voters to cast their ballots in the special election, banned by Governor J. C. Walton.

Reports throughout the state were that the balloting started in an orderly manner in nearly all places. In only a few counties where Governor Walton's political supporters are in charge of the polling places failed to open.

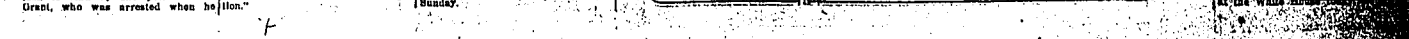

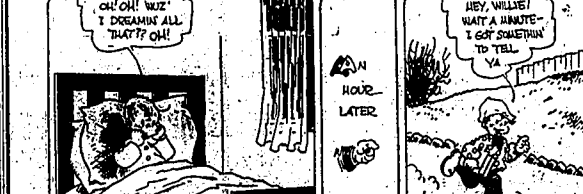
CHICAGO, Oct. 2.-Grain prices were irregular at the close of the Chicago Board of Trade today.
