

CENTRAL AMERICA SOUND FINANCIALLY

While every government in Europe has increased its debt enormously during the last ten years, the five Central American gov-ernments all have smaller funded debts than they had ten years ago. Prior to the war, now capital for these governments came chiefly from London and Paris: American interests are now pre-dominant in Central America, but as yet have done-tittle bur- no long term financing for our five southern neighbors.

Our failure to undertake more constructive work in Central America is to be regretted; first, because the lack of foreign capital has somewhat retarded progress in that part of the world; secondly, because some apportunities for the profitable employment of our capital and expansion of our trade have been neglected. It is true that Costa Rican and Nicaraguan government finances have been rehabilitated through our co-operation, and Honduras has made an adjustment of its debt which clears the way for the in-vestment of American capital; but such construction as has been done by Central American governments in the last ten-years has

done by Central American governments in the first energies on been financied entirely from domestic resources.

During the same period the production and trade of these countries has expanded steadily, and their economic position today in probably better than it ever has been. Especially metable has been their management of currency problems; with the exception of Guatemala, there has been no paper currency inflation, and the exchange rates of Costa Riea, Nicaragua, Honduras and Salvador have been stable for a long time close to par. In view of the fact that the currencies of old-established gold-standard countries like Denmark, Norway, Holland and Great Britain are selling at a discount from the United States dollar, the currency record of Central America is a remarkable tribute to the financial acumen of its leaders.—New York Commercial and Financial World,
