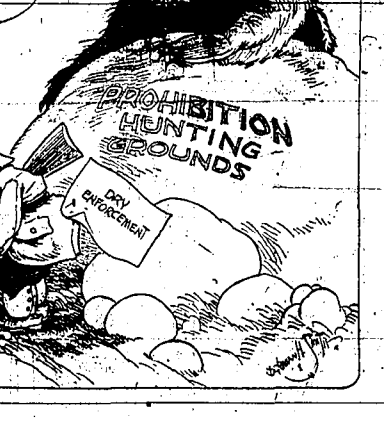

Local Team Advanced Almost At Will Against Normal Players. Good Crowd Witnesses One Sided Battle. Twin Falls Goal Never in Danger; Aman, Formerly of Fillet, Plays Well.

Displaying some of last year's form, the Twin Falls high school football team won from Albion Normal yesterday afternoon, 68 to 0 in their first home game of the season.

At no time during the contest was the Twin Falls goal line threatened, while end runs and off tackle bugs by the Blue and White team were the order of the scores.

REV. JESSE BAIRD ON RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

There is a world of good sense in the advice given by Rev. Jesse H. Baird, pastor of the First Presbyterian church of Boise, in his address before the Idaho State Federation of Women's clubs, at its recent meeting in the capital city. Speaking of religious liberty and work of Americanization, Rev. Mr. Baird said:

"Unless we can maintain the old frontier spirit of fair play and of square dealing, without laws to enforce them, our liberties are doomed. Religious liberty is becoming harder as we become more crowded together, as the other man's creed begins to interfere with the free exercise of mine. Religions war, like that which has cursed Europe and Asia through all the centuries, is threatening America. Can religious liberty in America survive the days of our national youth? Only if we can back it up with a great spirit of tolerance and generous fair play. The development of true Americanism, the amalgamation of the foreigner, was easy when there was lots of room beyond the frontier. We sent him out there to wear off his foreign traits and ideas. Then when he was thoroughly Americanized, we brought him into our midst and liked him first rate. Today that foreigner must be Americanized by our side. We don't like him and we tend to let him know it. As soon as that spirit is manifest, the process of Americanization ceases. There already arises the peril and the fear of America becoming, instead of a nation, a collection of unamalgamated foreign groups."

"Can America grow up and still keep the spirit of her youth? Can she endure the passing of her frontier, and still retain the fine traits which that frontier produced—democracy, liberty, religious freedom, Americanism? Only if she can replace material facts with spiritual. If America can build upon the spirit of her godly founders and rise today to a great spirit of generous good will, of tolerance, of self-control, of service and unselfishness; if she can undergird her ideals with such a spiritual foundation, then

they are safe. Otherwise, within a century, America will sink into the same class-ridden, intolerant, quarrelsome, government-burdened condition in which we see the nations of the old world today. Democracy, liberty, religious freedom, Americanism, will have passed as mere incidents of our national youth."

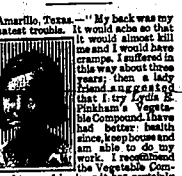

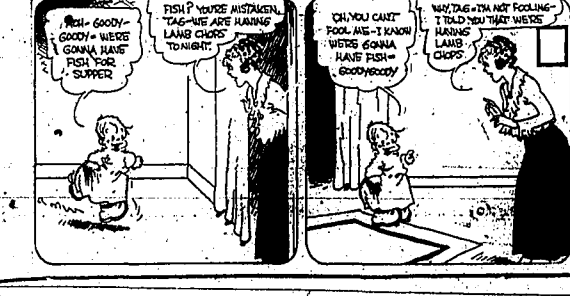
