Profitable dairy cows may be had in two ways. First, they may be purchased. This is no doubt, the most expensive way, but necessary in many cases in order to get a start. In purchasing cows you take chances on getting individuals not so good as they look, for often the best judge of dairy cattle are fooled by the value of cows. This also, there is the chance of bringing in diseases such as tuberculosis, contagious abortion, and other troubles.

A well-bred bull is not only a trophy, but one having the right to be regarded as a fine of high butterfat and milk producer, and out of a dam with a good butterfat record, nothing but good cows can be expected.

When the herd is first placed on pasture, it is necessary to give it a fall, a grassy tract, also caused in the milk for a short time, not only making the milk objectionable to taste, but affecting the butter yield.

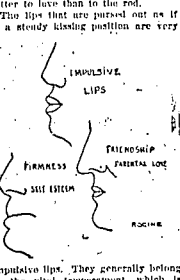
