



To keep cement moving from the mills to the many building jobs always under way, cement manufacturers require an astonishing quantity of sacks.

This year the industry has consider-This year the industry has considerably more than 225,000,000 sacks. These represent enough cotton cloth to make a skirt for every woman and girl in the United States—126,000 miles of 30-inch fabric. 
