In November, 1922, the United States Veterans Burgeau, created to provide adequate care and assistance for persons disabled in the World war, entered into a contract with a private concern whereby, it has been testified at a senate committee inquiry now in progress, \$3,000,000 worth of property at a Maryland supply depot at Perry-ville was sold as surphs material for \$600,000. Less than one-fourth of the goods, the committee has been told, was really surplus. Dr. Frederick C. Smith, of the public health service, said that he made repeated efforts to get Colonel Charles R. Forbes, director of the bureau, to turn over to that service sheets, bandages, gauge and other materials that it was proposed to self. Surgeon-General Cumming wrote Colonel Forbes that these materials could be used by the public health service at a "tremendous saving to the government."

President Harding learned of the situation about two weeks after the agreement was entered into, and sent Brigadier-General Charles E. Sawyer to Perryville to investigate. 




