

BEZZARD KILLS MANY IN MEXICO

Twelve Persons Have Frozen to Death and Others Driven to Insanity as the Worst Blizzard in History Sweeps Deming and Vicinity; Family Frozen in Schooner.

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Dec. 12.—Twelve persons have frozen to death, the thirteenth is near death and another has been driven to insanity as reports of the worst blizzard in the history of New Mexico continue to pour into Albuquerque.

Rescue parties, accompanied by physicians and nurses have set out from Deming to aid hundreds of tourists stranded in the desert country near Cambray.

Bodies of five members of one family were found, all frozen to death in two tragic accidents near Huelan. Charred remains from a blizzard camp showed that the wind had put out their fire, the last hope of their lives.

Caught in the blizzard while on their way to a neighboring ranch for their money, two men and a child, caught in a blizzard and died, perished in an abandoned school house in which they had sought shelter.

Bodies of the two boys were found by a searching party. The school house is near Clivia.

One tourist party was found in a cemetery chapel near Levy, where they had sought shelter from the blizzard.

Stock is starving for lack of fodder throughout the entire storm area, according to reports.

Material loss as a result of the storm probably will run into six figures, according to the estimates today.

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WORLD WIDE SEARCH FOR OIL SWINDLER

CHICAGO, Dec. 12.—A world wide search was started today for Leo Koretz, a Russian millionaire, charged with operating a \$5,000,000 "oil swindle."

Crowe took personal charge of a raid on Koretz's office, occupying the entire floor of a downtown building, and after a preliminary investigation announced he would enlist the aid of police in every city of the United States in a search for Koretz, who has been missing for more than a week.

Koretz, according to Crowe told his friends he owned 10,000 acres of land in Panama on which "coldest oil" had been found.

Koretz was last heard from in New York. Authorities working under Crowe believe he sailed either for Europe or South America. His wife and young son were left in his large Manhattan house.

FAKE DOCTORS

At least 25,000 bogus physicians and surgeons are practicing "medicine" in the United States, according to some investigators of medical diploma mills. The figure is startling. Here's a major evil going along for years without the public suspecting it. Fortunately, it's a scandal that can be cleaned up quickly and thoroughly if the proper authorities so desire. No matter how thoroughly it may be suppressed, however, this evil will grow up again like a weed unless the various associations of legitimate physicians and surgeons act more vigilantly against watchdogs. We believe the hypocrisy, with efficiency, remains a national watchfulness.

If anyone you find the medical profession has long-standing work with untrained quacks. Do you stop to realize that every station

of human activity is similarly bogged down with incompetents. It's just as harmful to the community at large as the phony M. D. in his unfortunate activities.

Lawyers, judges, politicians, newspapermen, financiers, managers, business men, are plenty of these who are thoroughly trained yet totally inhibited for their work by reason of warped ethics, natural incompetence, stupidity and dishonesty.

In the real ability stands out in the sea of incompetence like the proverbial blackberry in a bowl of milk.

Any one with a sense of decency is appalled by the thought of an ignorant, untrained quack "treating" sick people who need expert help. The fact that thousands of such quacks are at work, is a revelation of the frightful things many men resort to in the mad scramble for money. There seems to be no limit to degradation, where money is at stake. Civilization is a wretched failure—financially.

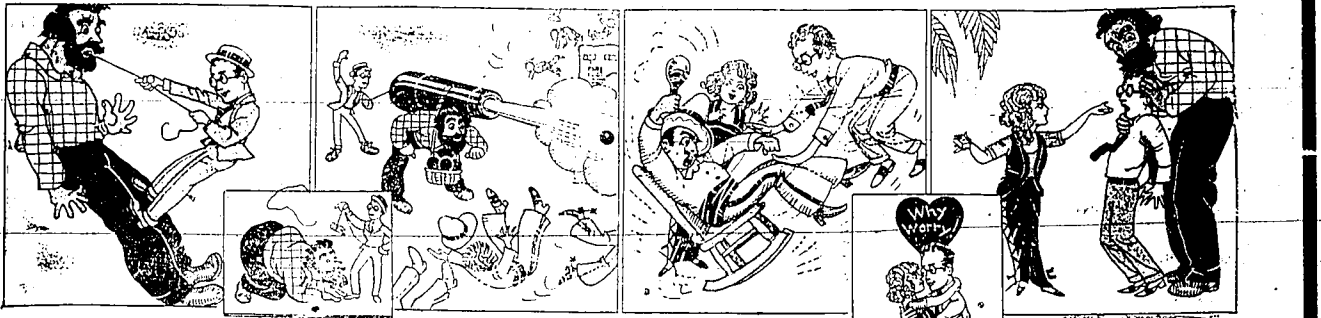

The reason for the receivership, according to officials of the company, is that there are not sufficient funds available at the present time to pay demands which are being made on the company. The chief reason for this lack of funds is the declining price of gasoline. The company must handle a supply of 600,000 gallons of gasoline, which it has been compelled to sell at a loss on the declining market.

The receivership is necessary to prevent numerous suits which would result in losses to the company, officials added yesterday, and it is anticipated that all credits of a substantial sum left for distribution to the stockholders.

Company Will Continue. "The company will continue to operate under the receivership," E. L. Copeland, president and manager, said yesterday. "The Independent Gasoline and Oil company has had a hard fight against the Standard Oil company, but we will continue to operate in this territory of good gasoline."

The Petroleum and Refiners corporation which furnished us with gasoline. Mr. Copeland continued to say that while he had a verbal agreement in to credit for expansion, was held out to the Prairie Oil and Gas company November 12, the latter being a subsidiary of the Standard Oil company. They saw they could not control of the Independent Gasoline and Oil company by demanding the payment of their account. They forced their verbal agreement with us and demanded settlement." Asked in regard to the controversy.

Donald McLean said that the trouble in Salt Lake City in no way affected the operation of the company here. It does not mean insolvency and is being settled. There has been some confusion on the board of directors which is being adjusted.

Will Punish Infractions. Last year some boys threw rocks into the water and spoiled part of the rink. This year the police will be asked to take any such misbehaving youngsters into custody and bring them before the police court or the probation officer. Last year a great number of children enjoyed the pleasure of skating during the cold season.

The attention of the city directors to the necessity of prompt action in this case was focused by the activity of James McMillan who visited the city authorities today.
