TAX REDUCTION SCHEME WILL BE DISCUSSED

Congressman Mills Gives Views on Mellon's Plan for Reduction of Taxes; Sur-tax Expected to Create Furore in Congress; Other Interviews to Follow.

Editorial Note. There are almost as many different views in congress on tax reduction as there are members. While all apparently agree taxes should be reduced, the method best suited to the purpose is in dispute. The following article is the first of a series setting forth the views of leaders of the principal groups of thought in congress on tax reductions.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 18. — That Congress will not adopt a tax reduction plan as a whole seems "incredible" to Representative Orson L. Mills, New York member of the House of Commons.

Mills is perhaps the staunchest supporter in the house of the Mellon plan. He believes it is the soundest tax reduction scheme adopted so far.

M'ADOO IS NOW CANDIDATE FOR '24 NOMINATION

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 18. — William G. McAdoo is regarded today as a moderate ticket for president on the democratic ticket.

Formal acceptance of the platform of the South Dakota proposal con-

vention will be held Saturday at the W. W. Howes, democratic state chairman, at Pierre, S. D. McAdoo





As will be readily appreciated by coaches, critics, and the football public generally, the construction of the high-class teams in the season of 1923 has been radically changed. Not only is the make-up different, but the use of the men in the squad in the games has been quite unparalleled in the history of the sport. Almost all coaches have come to the conclusion that modern football requires a saying of men and a supplementing of the powers of a team by the interjection of fresh men at psychological moments. It combines heavy, powerful rushing men, speed men who could solidify against a powerful attack or open up against a fast-running or overhead offensive. On the first eleven all varieties are represented, while in the second and third elevens are men matched up for substitution so that power might be increased, more speed injected, or an overhead game covered.

And in this connection it is well to call the attention of the public to the fact that the wholesale substitution noticed in some of the big games of the year did not mean that there were more men injured than usual, but that the coaches had a greater wealth of material of about equal caliber.

As the modern development of football play has put such a tremendous burden upon the wing men—tackles and ends—to invent swishing interference, an All-American team must have this defensive asset. The players must have not only speed but weight and power. Smaller men, even though active and brilliant, are liable to be swept out of the way in the smother of this heavy interference. Hence, the two ends, as well as the two tackles of the All-American team this year are picked with suitable regard for the work they would be called upon to do in meeting this development of play.—Collier's National Weekly.

This is not a new idea on the Twin Falls tract, where farmers are co-operating steadily in furthering road improvement. The good roads movement is here to stay. In most countries the districts' paid for roads for the roads secured at the beginning in the experimental stage and this part of Idaho has been no exception. But the old plan of learning by trial and error is working, and the same error is not committed twice.


