DIXMUDE SHIP FELL INTO SEA BODIES FOUND

Two More Bodies of French Airship Found in Mediterranean Sea - Fragments of Dixmude Are Found and Indicate That Craft Burned Before Dropping in Water

PARIS, Jan. 2.—Bodies of two more of the missing dirigible "Dixmude" were found today, according to a message received here at 6:30 p. m. today.

The first airship of Dixmude was without difficulty repaired in the harbor. The "Dixmude" fell into the sea in the night of Dec. 31, 1923, and up until today, only one body, that of her commander, had been found.

The first airship, pilot of France, was shot down by German aircraft in the Mediterranean sea on Dec. 31, 1923, near Algeria. Storms blew the airship from the coast and it fell into the Mediterranean sea.

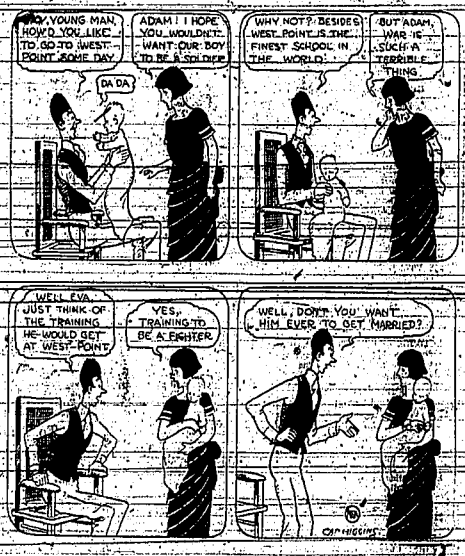

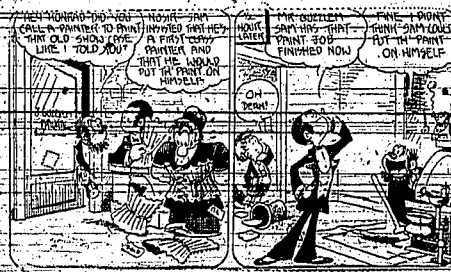
